Ordination to the Diaconate for Seminarians: Lizandro Barba Daniel Whalen On Saturday, April 11, St. Alfred's parish

son, Lizandro Barba, and seminarian intern for the Quo Vadis Domine Family since 2024, Daniel Whalen, will be ordained as Transitional Deacons for the Archdiocese of Detroit. Every Roman Catholic priest is first ordained to the Order of Deacons prior to his priestly ordination. There are two 'kinds' of Deacons in the Catholic Church:

- Permanent Deacons, who are typically married men who can proclaim the Gospel at Mass, celebrate the sacraments of Baptism and Holy Matrimony and enjoy the status of an ordained cleric in the Church. Their discernment realizes its conclusion with their ordination to the Diaconate. In our Family, we have three Permanent Deacons: Deacons Luis Flores & Fred Guardiola at St. Frances Cabrini and Deacon Scott LaForest at St. Alfred.

- Transitional Deacons are those who are on the path of discernment for the priesthood. They are seminarians who have typically been in formation for six to eight years, depending on what level they entered the seminary, and will eventually be ordained to the priesthood. They have the same abilities as Permanent Deacons.

This is a 'double blessing' for our QVD Family. We have the honor of accompanying these two young men towards the reason God placed them on this earth—to serve the people of God as a priest of Jesus Christ. Please continue to pray for all our seminarians, for Lizandro and Daniel as they anticipate their ordinations, and for many more from our parishes to follow in their footsteps.

4th Sunday of Lent: *Laetare*

The Fourth Sunday of Lent is traditionally called Laetare Sunday with the liturgical color changing from purple to rose. Laetare is a Latin word that means "rejoice." Today's Gospel describes the reason for our joy: God's great love for us has been revealed in Jesus. Through his Passion, Death, and Resurrection, Christ has reconciled us with God and one another. In this Jubilee Year, we pray as Pilgrims of Hope, made new in Christ.

On this Laetare ('Rejoice!') Sunda, y at the mid-point of Lent, our liturgy centers on the boundless forgiveness of our loving God. We may choose to turn away from his love, but God forever turns towards us, longing to embrace us with compassion and rejoicing when we come back to him.

In the First Reading God tells Joshua that he has taken away the shame of the people of Israel: their years in exile eating manna in the desert are over. From now on, they eat from the bounty of the land.

The generosity of God's goodness and forgiveness is proclaimed throughout the Psalm. God comes to us in our need and distress, desiring us to put aside our shame and be radiant with his transforming love.

In our Second Reading from Paul's letter to the Corinthians continues this feast of forgiveness. We are reconciled to God through Christ and in him we are a new creation, liberated from our sins.

Finally, the beautiful parable that Jesus shares in today's Gospel sums up the whole message of the Good News and the promise of reconciliation. This reconciliation is made complete through the events of Holy Week and Easter that we will soon celebrate.

Podemos elegir alejarnos de su amor, pero Dios siempre se vuelve hacia nosotros, anhelando abrazarnos con compasión y regocijándose cuando regresamos a él.

En la primera lectura, Dios le dice a Josué que ha quitado la vergüenza del pueblo de Israel: sus años de exilio comiendo maná en el desierto han terminado. A partir de ahora, comen de la generosidad de la tierra.

La generosidad de la bondad y el perdón de Dios se proclaman a lo largo del Salmo. Dios viene a nosotros en nuestra necesidad y angustia, deseando que dejemos a un lado nuestra vergüenza y seamos radiantes con su amor transformador.

En nuestra segunda lectura de la carta de Pablo a los Corintios continúa esta fiesta del perdón. Somos reconciliados con Dios a través de Cristo y en él somos una nueva creación, liberados de nuestros pecados.

Por último, la hermosa parábola que Jesús comparte en el Evangelio de hoy resume todo el mensaje de la Buena Nueva y la promesa de la reconciliación. Esta reconciliación se completa a través de los acontecimientos de la Semana Santa y de la Pascua que pronto celebraremos.

Fourth Sunday of Lent

Arm the Photon Torpedoes

Usually the first reading is picked to go with the Gospel. This week the connection appears to be a feast. The book of Joshua tells of the Israelites coming into the Promised Land, where they no longer needed to be fed with manna as in the desert.

They had been wandering much longer than expected because of their unfaithfulness. But now they are forgiven, and so celebrate the Passover with food from the land.

Then we hear the Gospel parable about another feast. This one is also a celebration of forgiveness, for the prodigal son has returned to his father, and the father's forgiveness shows us how willing God is to forgive us. That's where we end the parable, right?

Wrong. The parable continues with the older son's complaint about a feast for his brother. Did you notice the words of the father that "everything I have is yours" (Luke 15:31)? He's not just being sentimental because they are family.

The younger brother had already taken his inheritance, so whatever was left will one day go to the older one. That son cannot forgive his brother and is angry at the father for welcoming the prodigal back. This is where we come in.

Most of us have no trouble asking God's forgiveness. But we may have trouble forgiving others. We are so used to thinking in terms of justice that we are not satisfied with forgiveness. When I have been hurt, I feel like hitting back.

When you see an action movie, you don't want the bad guy to give up and say he's sorry—you expect him to be destroyed by the good guy, hopefully in a big fight or a spectacular explosion. (Superheroes, however, almost never kill the bad guy.)

So we have to ask ourselves whose idea of justice we live by. Is it the human expectation of an eye for an eye? Or is it God's justice, which is mercy and forgiveness? When someone cuts you off in traffic, do you feel like firing the photon torpedoes, or offering forgiveness?

The Golden Rule could be "Forgive others as you would be forgiven." Jesus gave his life for the sins of the world. Do we have the right to ask for more.
