Happy Easter!

We began our Lenten journey with a recognition of our sinfulness on Ash Wednesday... 'turn away from sin and follow the Gospel.' We followed Jesus as we accepted His invitation to take up our cross through acts of prayer,

penance, and sacrifice, so that we might more wholeheartedly follow Him.

We were with Jesus as He triumphantly entered Jerusalem on Palm Sunday...on Holy Thursday when He bent low and washed our feet to prepare us for reception of His Body & Blood in the Eucharist...on Good Friday when He endured the humiliation and passion of the Cross to provide for us a path towards salvation. Having sat at the table with Him and having stood at the cross with Him, we can now stand at the empty tomb and proclaim, with Mary Magdalene, Peter and John, *Jesus is Risen!* Death did not have the final word. Light has overcome darkness; new and everlasting life is offered to all people.

Today, on Easter Sunday we stand with Mary Magdalene and the Apostles at the empty tomb. Mary was a loyal and faithful disciple of Jesus as He preached to the crowds and healed the sick. She, with the other women, stood at the cross and watched her Savior die a very public and brutally painful death. Now after His death and burial, she is still looking for Him. Imagine her surprise and shock when she saw that the huge stone that covered the tomb was rolled away. Imagine her shock and disappointment when she saw that the tomb was empty.

Today, we are called to follow Mary's example; we too are asked to go and tell, to go and share the Good News of our faith with others. Like the first to witness the empty tomb, like St. Constance, St. Frances Cabrini, St. Alfred and Blessed Solanus Casey, we too are called to be missionary disciples who share and proclaim the Good News of the resurrection with all those we meet. We do this in countless ordinary ways through the devout practice of the faith as revealed to us through the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Mary and the first Apostles experienced the resurrection in a very personal way and then went and gave witness of what they beheld. Pope Francis, in his letter 'The Joy of the Gospel' says to each of us, *every Christian is a missionary to the extent that that they have experienced the love of God in Christ.*

Today, as we celebrate and experience the Resurrection of Jesus anew, let us go and share with others this incredible, inexhaustible, unrepeatable, Good News; Jesus is risen, death is defeated, light and goodness has

triumphed. Jesus is truly risen and alleluia is our eternal song! Happy Easter!

A New Day

If Easter brings us anything, it is a new day---a new way of living in the light of Jesus defeating death by rising from the dead. I pray it is this same disposition, this same outlook, that will motivate our days ahead as we continue to walk the path as a Family of Parishes.

The changes that are taking place don't have to be viewed as negative...that is a choice. They can be viewed as a new way of greeting, praying, worshipping, and being with the Lord. Let us continue to allow the Risen Lord to give us this new life.

The Resurrection of Christ

Fin de Semana en Birney's

¡Felices Pascuas!

Comenzamos nuestro camino de Cuaresma con el reconocimiento de nuestra pecaminosidad el Miércoles de Ceniza... "Aléjate del pecado y sigue el Evangelio". Seguimos a Jesús mientras aceptamos Su invitación de tomar nuestra cruz a través de actos de oración, penitencia y sacrificio, para que pudiéramos seguirlo de todo corazón.

Estuvimos con Jesús cuando entró triunfalmente en Jerusalén el Domingo de Ramos... el Jueves Santo, cuando se inclinó y lavó nuestros pies para prepararnos para la recepción de Su Cuerpo y Sangre en la Eucaristía... el Viernes Santo, cuando soportó la humillación y la pasión de la cruz para proporcionarnos un camino hacia la salvación. Después de habernos sentado a la mesa con Él y haber estado en la cruz con Él, ahora podemos estar ante el sepulcro vacío y proclamar, con María Magdalena, Pedro y Juan, *¡Jesús ha resucitado!* La muerte no tenía la última palabra. La luz ha vencido a las tinieblas; la vida nueva y eterna es ofrecida a todas las personas.

Hoy, el Domingo de Pascua, estamos con María Magdalena y los Apóstoles ante el sepulcro vacío. María fue una discípula leal y fiel de Jesús mientras predicaba a las multitudes y sanaba a los enfermos. Ella, con las otras mujeres, se paró en la cruz y vio a su Salvador morir de una muerte muy pública y brutalmente dolorosa. Ahora, después de su muerte y sepultura, ella todavía lo está buscando. Imagínese su sorpresa y conmoción cuando vio que la enorme piedra que cubría la tumba había sido removida. Imagínese su sorpresa y decepción cuando vio que la tumba estaba vacía.

Hoy estamos llamados a seguir el ejemplo de María; también a nosotros se nos pide que vayamos y contemos, que vayamos y compartamos la Buena Nueva de nuestra fe con los demás. Como los primeros en presenciar el sepulcro vacío, como san Constanza, santa Francisca Cabrini, san Alfredo y el beato Solanus Casey, también nosotros estamos llamados a ser discípulos misioneros que comparten y proclaman la Buena Nueva de la resurrección con todos aquellos con los que nos encontramos. Hacemos esto de innumerables maneras ordinarias a través de la práctica devota de la fe que se nos revela a través de la Pasión, Muerte y Resurrección de Jesucristo.

María y los primeros apóstoles vivieron la resurrección de una manera muy personal y luego fueron y dieron testimonio de lo que contemplaron. El Papa Francisco, en su carta 'La Alegría del Evangelio' nos dice a cada uno de nosotros, *cada cristiano es un misionero en la medida en que ha experimentado el amor de Dios en Cristo.*

Hoy, mientras celebramos y experimentamos de nuevo la Resurrección de Jesús, vayamos y compartamos con los demás esta Buena Nueva increíble, inagotable, irreplicable; Jesús ha resucitado, la muerte ha sido derrotada, la luz y el bien han triunfado. ¡Jesús ha resucitado verdaderamente, y el aleluya es nuestro canto eterno! ¡Felices Pascuas!

Letter from the Athletic Director

Winter Sports Review

This year's winter sports season has been nothing short of eventful. The season has continued to bring our community together in support of Cabrini's student-athletes.

The Cabrini boys basketball program had a strong season. The Varsity boys finished the season with a record of 16-7. They were Co-Catholic League Champions for the season in the Catholic League for the Intersection 2 Division. JV basketball finished the season 9-8 and were awarded the sectional award for the Intersectional 2 Division in the Catholic High School League. Congrats to Coach Joe Osmulski, Head Varsity Boys' Basketball Coach, who won Coach of the Year in the Intersectional 2 Division of the Catholic League.



The Cabrini girls basketball program also enjoyed success this season. The Varsity Girls had a record of 18-4. The JV girls basketball program posted a 12-5 record. The Varsity team qualified for the Catholic League Tournament and made it to the championship game. Later on in the season, the Varsity girls team went on to win the District Championship in the state tournament against Riverview Gabriel Richard.







The Empty Tomb Changed the World

The significance of the empty tomb cannot be overstated.

It is the foundation of our faith and the source of our hope. As Catholics, our actions would be in vain if the tomb was not empty. But it was, and this is what gives our faith its purpose and our hope its substance. We are called to live out this faith and pass it on to others, just as previous generations have done for over two thousand years.

As Catholics, Easter is not a one-day event but a life-changing reality that transforms our perspective and gives us hope to be with the Lord for all eternity. Our faith is not fantasy but reality, a reality that we get to live and share with our family and those we interact with on a daily basis. The Church affirms this reality by inviting us to celebrate the Octave of Easter (8 days ending on Divine Mercy Sunday) and the Easter Season (50 days ending on Pentecost).

As we read in the Gospel, Mary Magdalene was the first to witness the empty tomb, the first to enter into it. St. Thomas Aquinas called her the "Apostle of the Apostles." Imagine sharing the Good News of Jesus' Resurrection with His very own followers!

This Easter, may we worship, thank the Lord, celebrate, and be filled with the joy of Jesus, just like the first witnesses of His resurrection did. May the powerful truth of this greatest of Feasts pour into the ordinary moments of our lives and sanctify them. The details of how we live the faith matter, for from our heart spills out our love, belief, and faith in Jesus, which we then share with our family, friends and the greater community.

The tomb is empty, just as He said!

The First Sunday of Easter

Eastertime lasts fifty days: seven weeks of seven days (seven equals Biblical perfection) plus one day: perfection plus!

Like an eight-day Jewish wedding, or a child who can't bear to let go of Christmas, birthdays, and school vacation, the Church celebrates the Easter Octave: "the marriage of heaven and earth," as the Vigil calls Jesus' resurrection; our new members' baptismal rebirth; our renewal of baptismal vows; our hearts' "divine vacation" (Latin vacare, "to be empty"), newfound time and space for love of God and neighbor.

Make home an Easter garden! Adorn the dining table with a pillar candle (your "paschal candle"), a bowl full of water (ideally, from the parish's baptismal font), a vase of flowers or bowl of sprouting grain with Easter eggs.

Even non-singers can handle the three-fold Gospel Alleluia!

Let that be your grace before meals, perhaps with a prayer recalling Emmaus (Luke 24:13-35): "Be known to us, Risen Lord Jesus, as you were to the first disciples, in your word, in the breaking of bread, and in everyone we meet."


