

Weekend at Birney's



Congratulations Fr. Grayson and Welcome Fr. Jose Roberto da Silva Franca

It was announced last weekend by Archbishop Weisenburger, that Fr. Grayson will be reassigned to the West Maple Family of Parishes in the role as Full-Time Priest Support. This

Family of Parishes includes: Holy Name, Birmingham; St. Owen, Bloomfield Hills; St. Regis, Bloomfield Hills and my home parish of Our Lady Queen of Martyrs, Beverly Hills. Fr. Grayson will live at OLQM with Msgr. Ron Browne, and primarily serve the people of this community. His time with our Quo Vadis Domine family was short, but his faithfulness as a priest of Jesus Christ was well received. This move will not take place until July 1. At that time, a priest from Brazil, Fr. Jose Roberto da Silva Franca, who is fluent in English, Spanish and his native tongue, Portuguese, will join our FOP and reside at St. Frances Cabrini. Prayers for both as they prepare to embark on new assignments in service to God's people.

Election of a new Pope

As we continue to mourn and offer prayers for the repose of the soul of Pope Francis, the 'Pope of the People', and one who faithfully walked in the footsteps of the Good Shepherd, the Church, as it has done for 2,000 years, continues to move forward upon the mission of spreading the Good News. It is both a time of reverence for the man who was the Servant of the Servants for the past 12 years, and a recognition that the mission of the Church is never about one person, but fidelity to Christ, the Head of the Church. The Vatican has announced the conclave will begin Wednesday, May 7. Under church rules, it must start within 15 to 20 days after the pope's death.

How does the papal conclave work?

The process dates back hundreds of years — an intricate, choreographed procession of rituals and ballots. On the first day of the papal conclave, the cardinal electors will shut themselves off from the outside world and begin the momentous task of choosing — likely from among their own ranks — the man who will become the 267th Bishop of Rome, better known as the pope.

On day one, the cardinals celebrate a morning Mass in St. Peter's Basilica. In the afternoon, they walk in a solemn procession into the Sistine Chapel, which will have undergone a security sweep to check for any illicit recording devices before their arrival. For centuries, the cardinal electors were physically locked inside the Sistine Chapel until they elected a new pontiff, left to eat and sleep beneath Michelangelo's vivid Renaissance masterpiece.

These days, they do leave to rest and share meals at Santa Marta House — a hotel-like residence inside Vatican City where Francis had his own personal apartment during his pontificate. Once the cardinals have all filed into the chapel, its great bronze doors are dramatically closed and sealed, and the first day's voting begins.

How does the voting for a new pope work?

The cardinals will have already shared discussions about the Church in "general congregations" before the conclave begins. Choosing the new pope requires a two-thirds plus-one vote among the cardinal electors. Each cardinal must swear an oath of absolute secrecy before they vote. If they disclose any information from within the conclave they will be excommunicated by the church.

To vote, each cardinal writes their chosen candidate's name on a ballot, disguising his handwriting, then walks to an altar at the front of the chapel and deposits the paper onto a ceremonial plate. He then tips the ballot from the plate into a chalice-urn. As they are counted and the handwritten entries recorded by three cardinals at the altar, known as scrutineers, the ballots are deposited into another urn.

A third urn, made of gilded bronze and silver and adorned with Christian imagery, is used to ferry ballots from any cardinals too ill to leave their sleeping quarters to the chapel for counting. After the first vote is held on the first afternoon, the cardinals' ballots are placed into one of two small ovens inside the Sistine Chapel and burned. A plume of smoke flows up a chimney and into the air over St. Peter's Square, watched for eagerly by the faithful, and the world's media. If that round of voting yields no chosen candidate, the smoke will be black — a sign to the world that the Holy See remains vacant.

How long can a conclave last?

The voting process will repeat itself the following day, with the cardinals holding two ballots in the morning and two in the afternoon. If the morning sessions are inconclusive, black smoke will be seen again from the chimney. If there's still no winner following the afternoon votes, more black smoke will stream into the early evening Roman sky.

If there's no two-thirds majority after three days, voting is paused for a day to allow time for prayer, discussion and a "brief spiritual exhortation" by the senior cardinal. Then the voting process resumes. A conclave will last until enough of the cardinal electors agree on a choice for the next pope.

Fin de Semana en Birney's

Felicitaciones Padre Grayson y bienvenido Padre José Roberto da Silva Franca

El fin de semana pasado fue anunciado por el Arzobispo Weisenburger, que el P. Grayson será reasignado a la Familia de Parroquias de West Maple en el papel de Apoyo al Sacerdote a Tiempo Completo. Esta familia de parroquias incluye: Holy Name, Birmingham; San Owen, Bloomfield Hills; St. Regis, Bloomfield Hills y mi parroquia natal de Nuestra Señora Reina de los Mártires, Beverly Hills. El P. Grayson vivirá en OLQM con Mons. Ron Browne, y servirá principalmente a la gente de esa comunidad. Su paso por nuestra familia Quo Vadis Domine fue corto, pero su fidelidad como sacerdote de Jesucristo fue bien recibida. Este movimiento no se llevará a cabo hasta el 1 de julio. En ese momento, un sacerdote de Brasil, el P. José Roberto da Silva Franca, que habla con fluidez inglés, español y su lengua materna, el portugués, se unirá a nuestra FOP y residirá en Santa Francisca Cabrini. Oraciones por ambos mientras se preparan para embarcarse en nuevas asignaciones al servicio del pueblo de Dios.

Elección de un nuevo Papa

Mientras continuamos llorando y ofreciendo oraciones por el descanso del alma del Papa Francisco, el "Papa del Pueblo", y uno que caminó fielmente en los pasos del Buen Pastor, la Iglesia, como lo ha hecho durante 2.000 años, continúa avanzando en la misión de difundir la Buena Nueva. Es a la vez un tiempo de reverencia por el hombre que fue el Siervo de los Siervos durante los últimos 12 años, y un reconocimiento de que la misión de la Iglesia nunca se trata de una persona, sino de la fidelidad a Cristo, la Cabeza de la Iglesia. El Vaticano ha anunciado que el cónclave comenzará el miércoles 7 de mayo. Según las reglas de la Iglesia, debe comenzar dentro de los 15 a 20 días posteriores a la muerte del papa.

¿Cómo funciona el cónclave papal?

El proceso se remonta a cientos de años: una intrincada procesión coreografiada de rituales y papeletas. En el primer día del cónclave papal, los cardenales electores se aislarán del mundo exterior y comenzarán la tarea trascendental de elegir, probablemente entre sus propias filas, al hombre que se convertirá en el 267º obispo de Roma, más conocido como el Papa.

El primer día, los cardenales celebran una misa matutina en la Basílica de San Pedro. Por la tarde, caminan en una solemne procesión hacia la Capilla Sixtina, que habrá sido sometida a un barrido de seguridad para verificar si hay dispositivos de grabación ilícitos antes de su llegada. Durante siglos, los cardenales electores estuvieron físicamente encerrados dentro de la Capilla Sixtina hasta que eligieron a un nuevo pontífice, dejados para comer y dormir bajo la vívida obra maestra renacentista de Miguel Ángel.

En estos días, se van a descansar y compartir comidas en la Casa Santa Marta, una residencia similar a un hotel dentro de la Ciudad del Vaticano donde Francisco tuvo su propio apartamento personal durante su pontificado. Una vez que todos los cardenales han entrado en la capilla, sus grandes puertas de bronce se cierran y sellan drásticamente, y comienza la votación del primer día.

¿Cómo funciona la votación de un nuevo Papa?

Los cardenales ya habrán compartido discusiones sobre la Iglesia en "congregaciones generales" antes de que comience el cónclave. La elección del nuevo Papa requiere dos tercios más uno de los votos de los cardenales electores. Cada cardenal debe prestar un juramento de absoluto secreto antes de votar. Si revelan cualquier información dentro del cónclave, serán excomulgados por la iglesia.

Para votar, cada cardenal escribe el nombre de su candidato elegido en una papeleta, disfrazando su letra, luego camina hacia un altar en la parte delantera de la capilla y deposita el papel en una placa ceremonial. Luego inclina la boleta del plato hacia una urna de cáliz. A medida que se cuentan y las anotaciones manuscritas son registradas por tres cardenales en el altar, conocidos como escrutadores, las papeletas se depositan en otra urna.

Una tercera urna, hecha de bronce y plata dorados y adornada con imágenes cristianas, se utiliza para transportar las papeletas de los cardenales demasiado enfermos para salir de sus dormitorios a la capilla para el recuento. Después de que se lleva a cabo la primera votación en la primera tarde, las papeletas de los cardenales se colocan en uno de los dos pequeños hornos dentro de la Capilla Sixtina y se queman. Una columna de humo sube por una chimenea y se eleva en el aire sobre la Plaza de San Pedro, atenta a la espera de los fieles y de los medios de comunicación de todo el mundo. Si en esa ronda de votación no se elige a ningún candidato, el humo será negro, una señal para el mundo de que la Santa Sede sigue vacante.

¿Cuánto tiempo puede durar un cónclave?

El proceso de votación se repetirá al día siguiente, con los cardenales realizando dos votaciones por la mañana y dos por la tarde. Si las sesiones matutinas no son concluyentes, se volverá a ver humo negro desde la chimenea. Si aún no hay un ganador después de las votaciones de la tarde, más humo negro fluirá hacia el cielo romano de la tarde.

Third Sunday of Easter

“Smoting” or Non-“smoting”?

Some times I get angry at things that frustrate me. I’m driving home and traffic slows to a crawl. The electricity goes out while I’m watching a favorite show. So I have to struggle with the line in our first reading, where the disciples were “rejoicing that they had been found worthy to suffer dishonor for the sake of the name” (Acts 5:41). They weren’t just frustrated; they were flogged for believing in Jesus. And still they rejoiced.

Imagine rejoicing over pain and suffering. These disciples had seen Jesus on the cross. When he rose from the dead, they began to see that his suffering was not a tragic loss, but a sign of his glory. They loved him so much that they took to heart his command to take up the cross. And when they suffered because they believed in him, as is recounted in today’s reading, they saw that as a way to imitate Jesus on the cross. Those who had followed him in life could also follow him to the cross—and many did that literally, by dying for their faith.

Most of us today rarely have the chance to die for our faith. We may wonder if we even have the courage it would take. Instead, we usually find ourselves suffering because we have done wrong. God does not use special interventions to smite sinners. Think of the times we were punished as a child. Think of the times we lost a friend because of a cruel remark. Think of the times we got a ticket for speeding. These are the result of our actions. These are sufferings that we would rather avoid.

Jesus, however, suffered for our sins when he was totally innocent. If he could do that, could we not accept suffering for our own sins when it comes? We may not be ready to rejoice in that suffering, but we can at least try to learn from it. If we behave differently because of it, if we can grow to be better persons, then that suffering can be our way of accepting the cross.

Of course, not all suffering is caused by the sins of the person suffering. The suffering of the innocent is a great mystery, a cause for sorrow and a challenge to help where we can. But like growing pains, all suffering is a step to new life in Christ. And that is what Easter is about.



Si no hay una mayoría de dos tercios después de tres días, la votación se detiene por un día para dar tiempo a la oración, la discusión y una "breve exhortación espiritual" por parte del cardenal principal. A continuación, se reanuda el proceso de votación. Un cónclave durará hasta que un número suficiente de cardenales electores se pongan de acuerdo sobre la elección del próximo papa.

¿Qué pasará una vez que el cónclave elija al próximo Papa?

Cuando suficientes cardenales se ponen de acuerdo sobre un candidato y la votación alcanza el umbral de dos tercios más uno, se le pregunta al hombre elegido si acepta el cargo. Él lo reconocerá simplemente diciendo la palabra "acepto" en latín: "Accepto". En ese momento, se convertirá en el nuevo Papa y dirá su nombre pontificio elegido ante los cardenales reunidos.

Luego, las boletas se queman en la estufa, pero esta vez, se omite un aditivo químico para crear la tan esperada columna de "fumata bianca", humo blanco. A continuación, el nuevo Papa entra inmediatamente en una cámara contigua a la Capilla Sixtina para ser revestido con las vestiduras papales.

Mientras los fieles y la multitud curiosa se reúnen en la Plaza de San Pedro, un cardenal sale al balcón central de la Basílica de San Pedro para presentar al nuevo pontífice con la famosa frase "Habemus papam" (Tenemos un papa).

What will happen once the conclave chooses the next pope?

When enough cardinals agree on a candidate and the vote reaches the two-thirds-plus-one threshold, the chosen man is asked if he accepts the role. He will acknowledge by simply saying the word for "I accept" in Latin: "Accepto." At that point, he becomes the new pope and will state his chosen pontifical name before the assembled cardinals.

The ballots are then burned in the stove, but this time, a chemical additive is left out to create the much - anticipated plume of "fumata bianca," white smoke. The new pope then immediately goes into a chamber adjoining the Sistine Chapel to be clad in the papal robes.

As the faithful and the curious crowd gathered in St. Peter's Square below, a cardinal steps out onto the central balcony of St. Peter's Basilica to introduce the new pontiff with the famous phrase, "Habemus papam" — We have a pope.




