While not technically a Catholic or Christian holiday, Mother's Day is still an important day of prayer and reflection for many, recognizing not only the gift of Mary to the Church, but the gift of mothers and motherlike figures in our lives. Mother's Day also falls during the Month of Mary, which the Church has recognized for centuries, turning to Our Lady as a guide to better know and love her Son, Jesus. God bless our mothers and let this be a day when we offer a prayer to Mary for intercession on behalf of all our loving mother's.

World Day of Prayer for Vocations

The purpose of World Day of Prayer for Vocations is to publicly fulfill the Lord's instruction to, "Pray to the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest" (Mt 9:38; Lk 10:2). As a climax to a prayer that is continually offered throughout the Church, it affirms the primacy of faith and grace in all that concerns vocations to the priesthood and to the consecrated life. While appreciating all vocations, the Church concentrates its attention this day on vocations to the ordained ministries (priesthood and diaconate), consecrated life in all its forms (male and female religious life, societies of apostolic life, consecrated virginity, secular institutes), and to the missionary life.

How blessed we are in our Quo Vadis Domine Family of Parishes to have newly ordained Deacon Dan Whalen assigned to minister in our parishes as a Transitional Deacon. He joins many others that have been part of our parishes for internships or diaconate from the past several years.

Doubly blessed are we to have a parish son from St. Alfred, Deacon Lizandro Barba, a fellow classmate of Deacon Dan, to also be part of our 'vocational



awareness' within our FOP. Deacon Lizandro and Dan were both recently ordained Transitional Deacons for the Archdiocese of Detroit. Deacon Lizandro is assigned as a Transitional Deacon to the Oakland Hills FOP (St. Damien of Molokai, Pontiac; St. Hugo, Bloomfield Hills; Sacred Heart, Auburn Hills; St. Benedict, Waterford; and St. Thomas More,

Troy). He lives and primarily ministers at the St. Damien parish. For both Deacon Dan and Lizandro, this is the final step in a long discernment process, that ultimately leads to ordination to the priesthood that will occur next year, Saturday, May 23, 2026.

And there is yet more....we also have a triple and quadruple blessing!



In addition to all the above, we also have a 2017 graduate of St. Frances Cabrini High School, Joseph Lennon, who is a parishioner at Divine Child, Dearborn and currently completing his second year in the School of Theology (sixth year overall) at Sacred Heart Major Seminary. Many of you will remember that Joseph

lived at St. Frances Cabrini parish for 2019-2020 school year for an internship. His ordination to the priesthood is scheduled for 2028.



Very proud to also announce, that a longtime student from both Cabrini Grade School, and soon-to-be 2025 graduate of Cabrini High School, Ralph Kaleniecki, will be entering Sacred Heart Major Seminary for his first year of College and ongoing discernment of the priesthood. His time in the Seminary will include four years of college (Liberal Arts, with a focus on Philosophy),

followed by four years of graduate work (School of Theology). It is a long road, but one filled with many graces. Ralph and his family are parishioners at Our Lady Star of the Sea, Grosse Pointe.

Please join me in praying for all these young men, for all the blessings we receive from their witness of discernment, and for many more to follow in their footsteps, as they courageously respond to the call from the Good Shepherd.

Una vez que los seminaristas alcanzan la finalización de su segundo año en la Facultad de Teología (escuela de posgrado), se les asigna a una parroquia durante el verano para una pasantía. Por lo general, continúan esa tarea hasta la finalización de los estudios y la formación. Dan estuvo con nosotros el verano pasado, y ahora regresa como Diácono de Transición para este verano y los fines de semana durante su último año escolar (2025-26). Verás al Diácono Dan en el Altar asistiendo a la Misa, predicando, presidiendo bautizos, bodas y servicios funerarios. Por favor, ofrezca una palabra de apoyo y oración mientras el Diácono Dan comparte sus dones y talentos al servicio del Señor dentro de nuestras parroquias.

El Día de la Madre también cae durante el Mes de María, que la Iglesia ha reconocido durante siglos, recurriendo a Nuestra Señora como guía para conocer y amar mejor a su Hijo, Jesús. Dios bendiga a nuestras madres y que este sea un día en el que ofrezcamos una oración a María por intercesión en nombre de todas nuestras amorosas madres.

Jornada Mundial de Oración por las Vocaciones

El propósito de la Jornada Mundial de Oración por las Vocaciones es cumplir públicamente la instrucción del Señor de "Rogad al Dueño de la mies que envíe obreros a su mies" (Mt 9:38; Lc 10,2). Como culmen de una oración que se ofrece continuamente en toda la Iglesia, afirma la primacía de la fe y de la gracia en todo lo que concierne a las vocaciones al sacerdocio y a la vida consagrada. Aun apreciando todas las vocaciones, la Iglesia concentra su atención este día en las vocaciones a los ministerios ordenados (sacerdocio y diaconado), a la vida consagrada en todas sus formas (vida religiosa masculina y femenina, sociedades de vida apostólica, virginidad consagrada, institutos seculares) y a la vida misionera.

Cuán bendecidos somos en nuestra Familia de Parroquias Quo Vadis Domine por tener al recién ordenado Diácono Dan Whalen asignado para ministrar en nuestras parroquias como Diácono de Transición. Él se une a muchos otros que han sido parte de nuestras parroquias para pasantías o diaconado en los últimos años.

Doblemente bendecidos somos de tener un hijo de la parroquia de San Alfredo, el Diácono Lizandro Barba, compañero de clase del Diácono Dan, para que también sea parte de nuestra 'conciencia vocacional' dentro de nuestra FOP. El Diácono Lizandro y Dan fueron ordenados recientemente Diáconos de Transición para la Arquidiócesis de Detroit. El Diácono Lizandro es asignado como Diácono de Transición a la FOP de Oakland Hills (San Damián de Molokai, Pontiac; San Hugo, Bloomfield Hills; Sagrado Corazón, Auburn Hills; San Benito, Waterford; v Santo Tomás Moro, Troya). Vive y trabaja principalmente en la parroquia de San Damián. Tanto para el diácono Dan como para Lizandro, este es el paso final de un largo proceso de discernimiento, que finalmente conduce a la ordenación al sacerdocio que ocurrirá el próximo año, el sábado 23 de mayo de 2026.

¡Y aún hay más... también tenemos una bendición triple y cuádruple!

Además de todo lo anterior, también tenemos a un graduado en 2017 de la Escuela Secundaria St. Frances Cabrini, Joseph Lennon, quien es feligrés en Divine Child, Dearborn y actualmente está completando su segundo año en la Escuela de Teología (sexto año en general) en el Seminario Mayor del Sagrado Corazón. Muchos de ustedes recordarán que José vivió en la parroquia de Santa Francisca Cabrini durante el año escolar 2019-2020 para una pasantía. Su ordenación sacerdotal está prevista para 2028.

Muy orgulloso de anunciar también que un estudiante de larga data de la Escuela Primaria Cabrini y que pronto se graduará en 2025 de la Escuela Secundaria Cabrini, Ralph Kaleniecki, ingresará al Seminario Mayor del Sagrado Corazón para su primer año de universidad y discernimiento continuo del sacerdocio. Su tiempo en el Seminario incluirá cuatro años de universidad (Artes Liberales, con un enfoque en Filosofía), seguidos de cuatro años de trabajo de posgrado (Escuela de Teología). 



Fourth Sunday of Easter

Treasures from our Tradition

The reception of Holy Communion at Sunday Mass is such an expected feature of the Mass these days that it is surprising to realize that for many centuries, receiving Communion was a relatively rare event in the life of a faithful Christian.

"Easter duty" means that Catholics must celebrate reconciliation if aware of serious sin, and receive Holy Communion during the Easter season. For a while, this was a requirement of Easter week, and later extended to the whole season of fifty days, and even beyond that by a few weeks. For the majority of people long ago, this meant Communion was a once-a-year moment. A rather complex bureaucracy grew up around this rule in the Middle Ages.

Amazingly, people received a kind of token at confession admitting them to Communion in their home parish, which then kept careful records and reported them to the bishop.



Surviving records can tell us a great deal about our ancestors. In fact, people were encouraged to journey to the church of their baptism in order to fulfill their duty, and therefore the Easter duty includes in its origins a grateful pilgrimage to the font in which you were first embraced by Christ.

If your "Holy Mother Church" is within a drive, why not make a pilgrimage to that font be a feature of your Easter celebration of these fifty days?
