


Weekend at Birney's



Sixth Sunday of Easter

"This portion of John's Gospel comes near the end of the first of four chapters that make up Jesus' long farewell discourse at the Last Supper. This section of chapter 14 actually sums up the themes of the opening of the discourse: the Christian's life is not shaped by Jesus' absence but by God's abiding

presence; God's presence overcomes anxiety about God's absence; and the present holds in it the seeds of a fresh future shaped by love, not fear.

These verses also contain a glimpse of some of the other themes of the farewell discourse: Jesus' relationship with the Father and the disciples' relationship to Jesus connect the disciples to the Father as well. Jesus promises to send an Advocate or intercessor who will remind the disciples of everything that Jesus taught them and bring them peace. Jesus is preparing his disciples in advance for his absence so that they will continue to believe in him and not feel all alone after his return to the Father. After the initial excitement of his Easter appearances, Jesus will remain with his followers in a very different way throughout the centuries.

As our celebration of the Easter season is coming to an end, the liturgy reminds us that Jesus remains with us through the Holy Spirit, who teaches us everything we need to know, reminds us of all that Jesus taught, and brings us peace." (loyolapress.com)

CSA (Catholic Services Appeal) 2025: Feed My Sheep

Archbishop Weisenburger was asked to select a Gospel reading for his installation Mass in the Archdiocese of Detroit and chose this powerful exchange between our Lord and St. Peter in the Gospel of St. John, "Do you love me?" and he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you."

[Jesus] said to him, "Feed my sheep..." And when he had said this, he said to him, "Follow me" (John 21:15-17,19).

This calling is echoed in the Catholic Services Appeal, inviting each of us to respond to Christ's love by caring for those in need and supporting the ministries that bring the Gospel to life. We should be united in following Christ's command to love, serve, and share the abundant gifts we have received with our brothers and sisters across southeast Michigan.

The Catholic Services Appeal is an annual campaign that raises funds for the Archdiocese of Detroit's ministries, programs, and services that benefit all the faithful in southeast Michigan. This archdiocesan-wide campaign reinforces the fact that the local Church extends beyond church buildings.

The CSA is an opportunity for the faithful to respond to Christ's command "to love one another as I have loved

you" (John 15:12) by helping to fund services throughout the broader area of southeast Michigan. This collaborative, archdiocesan campaign is a way to demonstrate the unity of the larger Church and to fund these vital programs.

The day also serves to educate future generations about the costs of war and the importance of honoring those who serve. In doing so, Memorial Day strengthens collective memory and gratitude across communities.

Sexto Domingo de Pascua

"Esta porción del Evangelio de Juan llega casi al final del primero de los cuatro capítulos que componen el largo discurso de despedida de Jesús en la Última Cena. Esta sección del capítulo 14 resume los temas de la apertura del discurso: la vida del cristiano no está moldeada por la ausencia de Jesús, sino por la presencia permanente de Dios; La presencia de Dios supera la ansiedad por la ausencia de Dios; Y el presente contiene las semillas de un nuevo futuro moldeado por el amor, no por el miedo.

Estos versículos también contienen un vistazo de algunos de los otros temas del discurso de despedida: la relación de Jesús con el Padre y la relación de los discípulos con Jesús conectan a los discípulos con el Padre también. Jesús promete enviar un Abogado o intercesor que recordará a los discípulos todo lo que Jesús les enseñó y les traerá la paz.

Jesús está preparando a sus discípulos de antemano para su ausencia, para que continúen creyendo en él y no se sientan solos después de su regreso al Padre. Después de la emoción inicial de sus apariciones en Pascua, Jesús permanecerá con sus seguidores de una manera muy diferente a lo largo de los siglos.

A medida que nuestra celebración del tiempo de Pascua llega a su fin, la liturgia nos recuerda que Jesús permanece con nosotros a través del Espíritu Santo, que nos enseña todo lo que necesitamos saber, nos recuerda todo lo que Jesús enseñó y nos trae la paz". (loyolapress.com)

A diferencia del Día de los Veteranos, que honra a todos los que han servido en las Fuerzas Armadas de los EE. UU., el Día de los Caídos conmemora específicamente a aquellos que perdieron la vida en el servicio militar. Es más que un fin de semana largo, es un tributo nacional a los valientes hombres y mujeres que dieron sus vidas en defensa de la libertad y la democracia. Al recordar sus sacrificios, los estadounidenses reafirman los valores de servicio, coraje y unidad que son fundamentales para la identidad de la nación.

El día también sirve para educar a las generaciones futuras sobre los costos de la guerra y la importancia de honrar a los que sirven. Al hacerlo, el Día de los Caídos fortalece la memoria colectiva y la gratitud en todas las comunidades.

True friendship is one of life's greatest treasures—but when it is rooted in Jesus Christ, it becomes something even more profound: a sacred fellowship that reflects God's love, truth, and grace. Authentic Christian friendship is not merely about shared interests or emotional support; it is about walking together in faith, spurring one another on toward love and good deeds (Hebrews 10:24), and becoming more like Christ through mutual encouragement, accountability, and sacrificial love.

At the heart of Christ-centered friendship is **love**—not a love that is self-seeking or conditional, but one modeled after Jesus Himself: "Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends" (John 15:13). This love is humble, patient, forgiving, and anchored in truth. It does not enable sin or compromise integrity; instead, it calls each person higher—toward holiness, healing, and hope.

Such friendship is **honest** and **vulnerable**, yet safe. In Christ, friends can confess their sins to one another (James 5:16), share their burdens (Galatians 6:2), and rejoice in each other's victories without fear of judgment or jealousy. There is freedom in knowing that the bond is not based on perfection, but on grace.

Mary, The Immaculate Conception

Mary, the Mother of Jesus, is honored in a unique and profound way as the *Immaculate Conception*. This title does not refer to the conception of Jesus, but to Mary herself—proclaiming that from the first moment of her existence, she was preserved by God from original sin. By a singular grace and privilege, and in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, Mary was conceived immaculate - pure, untouched by the fallen nature inherited by all humanity. This was not by her own doing, but a divine act of grace, so that she could become the spotless vessel through whom the Savior would enter the world.

Her Immaculate nature points us to the holiness of God and His plan of salvation. Mary was the first to receive the fruit of Christ's redeeming work, even before His birth, showing us how God's grace can transform and prepare a soul for His purposes.

Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee!

Sixth Sunday of Easter

A Humble God

The second reading from Revelations gives us a picture of the new Jerusalem as a sign of the power and majesty of God. Yet the other two readings seem to describe a humble God who wishes "not to place on you any burden beyond . . . necessity" (Acts 15:28), and Jesus in the Gospel tells his disciples that "the Holy Spirit that the Father will send in my name . . . will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you" (John 14:26). This gentleness reminds me of an icon by the Russian monk Andrei Rublev that depicts the Trinity as three angels bowing in deference to each other. This humility may be what moved Jesus to say that "the Father is greater than I" (John 14:28). It is certainly a unique way of understanding God.

I used to think of free will as God's way of testing our worthiness for the kingdom of heaven. But it is more likely part of that same humility, God not being forced on us. While we are given ways to know God, especially through the scriptures and the witness of those who went before us in faith, God leaves us free to believe or not, to love God or not.

So does this mean God leaves us on our own to get through life? No, he gives us the Holy Spirit to teach and remind us of all that Jesus said. That "reminding" is an important way the Spirit helps us today. You may have spent years in religion classes or the RCIA process. When you need an answer to life's questions, the Spirit may remind you of something you heard from a teacher or read in the scriptures. As you pray over that question, the Spirit may help you understand how the scripture applies to you. So the more you read the Bible, the more likely that the Spirit will have something of which to remind you.

Lift Up Your Hearts

It can sometimes happen that a person can make a promise, but his heart is NOT IN IT. He might say it only because he figures that is what the other person just wants to HEAR.

Oh my....what a mistake! Sometimes, we just have to learn "the hard way."

In today's gospel, Jesus lets us know that we really need

"Whoever loves Me will keep My word... we will make our dwelling with Him.

So....the LORD is present with us....ALL THE TIME. This is the reality and the truth that Jesus Himself teaches us in His gospel....

"DO NOT LET YOUR HEARTS BE TROUBLED OR AFRAID."

Jesus encourages us and says so beautifully, ".... so that when it happens you may believe." (Jn 14:29). Jesus is ALWAYS with us; but we can forget so easily. We must develop a way of living life, just one day at a time....and always being aware that God is alive within our hearts.

So the Call of Jesus is for us to truly BELIEVE with all our hearts....to put our FAITH and our LOVE into ACTION. I conclude with these words of St. Augustine (430ad).

"Love has a hand to help others." It has feet to hasten to the poor and needy. It has eyes to see the misery and want. It has ears to hear the sighs and sorrow of others. That is what Love looks like."

Treasures from our Tradition

Why is it still Easter?

The lilies have long since faded. The roots of our tradition of fifty days of rejoicing from Easter to Pentecost lie in the seven-day rhythm of the Jewish week, drawn from the six days of creation plus a Sabbath day. A favorite name for the Lord's Day among our ancestors in the faith was "The Eighth Day," meaning that in Christ a breakthrough to a new humanity was achieved.

With that inner architecture, it makes sense to see Pentecost as a week of weeks, forty-nine days plus one, again signaling that a new age has begun in Christ and the outpouring of his Spirit. The Jewish appreciation for Pentecost gave rise to the Jubilee year, the fiftieth year, when debts were released and prisoners set free.

Today, the character of our Easter Sundays is conveyed by joyful Alleluias and the rite of sprinkling at Mass. Long ago, people expressed this joy by suspending all rules of fasting and by never kneeling at liturgy.

These customs all point to our conviction that time is holy. There is an elegant balance to the Christian year: forty days of Lenten fast and discipline give way to fifty days of unrestrained rejoicing. That's why it is still Easter!
