2025 CSA (Catholic Services Appeal): Feed My Sheep

One of the most frequent questions I receive in regards to this annual campaign: Is it better to give a large contribution to the Christmas collection or the CSA? The answer is most definitely the CSA. The CSA target goal for every parish is determined based on two numbers: weekly collection and Christmas collection. The more money that is received from these two sources, the higher our CSA goal will climb each year. On the other hand, if your 'sizeable or once a year contribution' is sent through the CSA, not only is it free from the 7% archdiocesan 'tax' applied to all parish income, it also has no impact on our CSA target for the next year, or ever. The Christmas collection is only free of the 'tax', but not the CSA. Every penny we receive over our target CSA goal, is returned to the parish, tax free and without any bearing on any future CSA. For example: Looking at your parish CSA goal for 2025 (see parish income report in bulletin). If we raise money over this amount, it is automatically placed in our parish account, tax free/CSA free....to be spent or saved however we see fit. While your check may be written to CSA, once we reach our goal, your generous contribution is going directly to your parish. Everybody benefits!

You can donate on-line (givesca.org) or through the forms sent home to each registered household. You can also pick one up in the parish office and/or register if you would like to become an active member of the parish. Please prayerfully consider assisting your parish to meet our fair share of this campaign and maximize

our financial well-being as a parish.

Seventh Sunday of Easter: Ascension of the Lord

"Today is our liturgical celebration of the Ascension of the Lord, when Jesus was taken to heaven on the 40th day after Easter. In Cycle C, our Gospel is taken from the conclusion of the Gospel of Luke.

There are similarities in the reports of Jesus' Ascension found in the Synoptic Gospels—Mark, Matthew, and Luke. In each account, Jesus assigns his disciples the task of proclaiming the Gospel to the entire world. There are also notable distinctions. In the Gospels of Mark and Matthew, the disciples are sent by Jesus to baptize as well as to preach. In Luke's Gospel, however, this commission to baptize is absent. Instead, Jesus directs the disciples to return to Jerusalem to await the fulfillment of his promise to send them the Holy Spirit. Curiously, only Mark and Luke actually report Jesus' Ascension into heaven. Matthew's Gospel concludes with Jesus' promise to remain with his disciples forever. Only the Gospel of Mark notes that Jesus ascended to sit at the right hand of God. In noting this, Mark teaches that Jesus' Ascension affirms the glory Jesus received from God after his death and Resurrection.

Those who believe in Jesus will be empowered to do what Jesus himself has done. Already in Mark's Gospel, during his ministry, Jesus sent his disciples out to preach, to heal, and to drive out unclean spirits. Now, they are sent again to do these things and more. From his place with God in heaven, Jesus helped his disciples, and he continues to help us as we try to live as his followers." (loyolapress.com)

CSA 2025 (Llamamiento de servicios católicos Llamamiento de servicios católicos): Apacienta mis ovejas

Una de las preguntas más frecuentes que recibo con respecto a esta campaña anual: ¿Es mejor dar una gran contribución a la colecta de Navidad o a la CSA? La respuesta es, sin duda, la CSA. El objetivo de la CSA para cada parroquia se determina con base en dos cifras: la colecta semanal y la colecta navideña. Cuanto más dinero recibamos de estas dos fuentes, más aumentará nuestra meta de CSA cada año. Por otro lado, si su contribución considerable o anual se envía a través de la CSA, no solo está exenta del impuesto arquidiocesano del 7% aplicado a todos los ingresos parroquiales, sino que tampoco afecta nuestra meta de CSA para el próximo año, ni para nunca. La colecta navideña sólo está libre del 'impuesto', pero no del CSA. Cada centavo que recibimos por encima de nuestra meta de CSA se devuelve a la parroquia, libre de impuestos y sin ninguna relación con ninguna CSA futura. Por ejemplo: analizando la meta de CSA de su parroquia para 2025 (consulte el informe de ingresos de la parroquia en el boletín). Si recaudamos dinero que supera esta cantidad, se coloca automáticamente en nuestra cuenta parroquial, libre de impuestos y de CSA... para gastarlo o ahorrarlo como creamos conveniente. Aunque su cheque esté a nombre de CSA, una vez que alcancemos nuestra meta, su generosa contribución irá directamente a su parroquia. ¡Todos se benefician!

Séptimo Domingo de Pascua: Ascensión del Señor

Hoy celebramos la Ascensión del Señor, cuando Jesús fue llevado al cielo el cuadragésimo día después de Pascua. En el Ciclo C, nuestro Evangelio se basa en la conclusión del Evangelio de Lucas. Existen similitudes en los relatos de la Ascensión de Jesús que se encuentran en los Evangelios Sinópticos: Marcos, Mateo y Lucas. En cada relato, Jesús encomienda a sus discípulos la tarea de proclamar el Evangelio al mundo entero. También hay distinciones notables. En los Evangelios de Marcos y Mateo, los discípulos son enviados por Jesús tanto a bautizar como a predicar. En el Evangelio de Lucas, sin embargo, esta comisión de bautizar está ausente. En cambio, Jesús ordena a sus discípulos regresar a Jerusalén para esperar el cumplimiento de su promesa de enviarles el Espíritu Santo. Curiosamente, solo Marcos y Lucas relatan la ascensión de Jesús al cielo. El Evangelio de Mateo concluye con la promesa de Jesús de permanecer con sus discípulos para siempre. Solo el Evangelio de Marcos menciona que Jesús ascendió para sentarse a la diestra de Dios. Al señalar esto, Marcos enseña que la Ascensión de Jesús confirma la gloria que Jesús recibió de Dios tras su muerte y resurrección.

Quienes creen en Jesús serán capacitados para hacer lo que Jesús mismo hizo. Ya en el Evangelio de Marcos, durante su ministerio, Jesús envió a sus discípulos a predicar, sanar y expulsar espíritus inmundos. Ahora, son enviados de nuevo para hacer estas cosas y más. Desde su lugar con Dios en el cielo, Jesús ayudó a sus discípulos y continúa ayudándonos a nosotros mientras intentamos vivir como sus seguidores. (loyolapress.com)

Dear Friends,

This June, as we progress through this 2025 Jubilee Year, our Quo Vadis Domine Family of Parishes has decided to consider "Vocation" as our theme of prayer. On June 20th we'll have a Holy Hour with songs and prayer at St. Mary Magdalen during which we will more deliberately consider this theme. Over the next five Sundays here in the bulletin I will offer some thoughts and reflections having to do with "vocation" and "vocations":

- The universal call to fullness of life
- The universal call to holiness
- Religious vocations
- Priestly vocations
- All other vocations in the Mystical Body

Before we even consider the call to holiness, there is a prior "call" from God for us to develop to our fullest — as Jesus says, "I have come that they might have life, and have it to the full" (Jn 10:10). Of course no life is full and complete without holiness, but let's not forget about all that raw material of our lives: body, mind, spirit, soul — that God loves, too. This is a part of His handiwork that He wants to see grow and develop. Pope Paul VI called this "integral human development" and Pope Benedict XVI was fond of this theme, as well (see *Caritas in Veritate*). Imagine God wanting to see your humanity flourish: for you to be healthy and fit in body, for our mind and psyche to be healed and stable, for your mind to be stimulated, sharp, and educated, for your senses to be alive and alert to beauty in nature and art, for you to develop skills and "know-how" that in some way play a part in building His Kingdom, even if that is sitting behind a computer to do something like accounting work or writing code. In this way, as well, we become responsible for the integral human development of each other when we each bring different gifts to a church, a school, an organization, a company, a nation.

To bring this topic to a practical point — what does your schedule look like? Do you have time and space for reading a good book? For visiting the DIA or walking through nature? For enjoying time with cherished friends? For prayer? For exercise? For proper sleep? In short, be an advocate for your own integral human development. Partner with God here. Your spiritual life can't advance if you ignore your humanity and what it needs to flourish.

We might miss this aspect of our faith ... the human, the natural, the raw material of life. To God, it all matters. Just like Sacraments impart a spiritual change or power, we should always remember that they are tied to some raw material of life — water, oil, bread, wine, our hands (action), minds, and hearts.

More next week, friends! For the moment, consider how God entered deeply into all of this — a family, a house, a neighborhood, a people, who read books (scrolls?!), ate, drank, and laughed together.

Tuesday, June 24: Midland

We'll begin with a tour of the Alden B. Dow Home and Studio. Alden B. Dow was an American architect based in Midland, Michigan and known for his contributions to the style of Michigan Modern. An included lunch will be at Lucky's Steakhouse. Following lunch we will experience the Dow Gardens, a 110-acre display of annuals and perennials and punctuated by distinctive bridges, children's garden, towering pines and delightful water features.

The day will end at Whiting Forest Canopy Walk, the nation's longest canopy walk, 1,400 feet long, soaring up to 40 feet above the ground. The bus leaves Cabrini at 6:30am and returns at 6:45pm. Cost: \$146.00.

The Ascension of the Lord

Coming or Going?

One way of looking at the Ascension is that Jesus can do much more for us in his glory than he could while on earth. How does this work? It happens in two steps. First, he sends the Holy Spirit to the disciples. Second, the disciples become his witnesses to all the nations. So let's look at the first step.

The Gospel of John that is read on the Vigil of Pentecost says that "there was . . . no Spirit yet, because Jesus had not yet been glorified" (John 7:39). Obviously the Spirit is co-eternal with the Father and the Son, so John is trying to get our attention. He means that we could not experience the gifts of the Spirit until Jesus had died and risen from the dead. While Jesus walked the earth, he chose to be limited in time and space, so that a few people could get to know and love him. But after his resurrection, he could be more effective by sending his Spirit to all believers. Because he is ascended into glory, he can live in all of us. Just as the power of the Holy Spirit caused Mary to be the mother of Jesus, so that same power enables Jesus to live in us. And that leads to the second step.

Before his death, Jesus began to collect a group of followers. Some got to know him more deeply and became disciples. The rest of the followers were merely curious or attracted by stories of miracles he had performed. They did not have the faith and courage to bring others to Jesus; some only stayed with him a short time. But after his ascension the disciples began to experience Jesus in each other. They could not help but be excited about that and spread that excitement to others. From the time of Jesus' ascension to our own time, people have boldly proclaimed the gospel. So Jesus' ascension actually makes him present to more people, not fewer. May we all experience that presence in the Spirit, seeing Jesus in ourselves and others.

Lift Up Your Hearts

On this feast of the Ascension, we hear the words of Jesus to His disciples of every era:

GO INTO THE WHOLE WORLD
AND PROCLAIM THE GOSPEL...

This is how we are called to live Life as His followers. In the final message of his life, our beloved Pope Frances said for all of us:
