My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Happy Mother's Day to all of our mothers! I hope and pray that you have a great day. You deserve a great day for what you've done in giving birth to your children and for all that you've done to care for them and raise them to be all that

God is calling them to be. Your vocation is beautiful and essential. I hope that you are showered with love and gratitude from your children today.

If we have been blessed to have a mother who loves us, we can never thank our mothers sufficiently for their love and for all that they have done for us. Today is a day, more than any other day, to express our gratitude. If your mother is living and is a blessing to you, tell her that you love her and thank her for everything she has been for you and for all that she has done for you. If your mother is deceased, thank her too for she surely hears you even better now. Pray for her peace and joy with God in heaven.

As I think about Mother's Day, I can't help but think of mothers I know, here and elsewhere, who are struggling for a variety of reasons – because they are mothers. There is the mother whose child is very chronically ill and frequently in the hospital. There is the unwed mother who has no support from the child's father and has to go it alone. There is the mother with a child in prison who has to worry not only about her child but also about caring for her grandchildren because their parent is in prison.

There is the mother who had to bury her child, young or older – something mothers are not supposed to have to do. There is the immigrant mother who lives in fear that her family will be split up by the unexpected deportation of her husband or herself to a place she fears returning to because of the dangers that are a part of life in her home country. There is the mother who has a hard time caring for the needs of her children in a world that can be very complex and difficult at times. It isn't easy for any woman to be a mother, even with the support of a good husband and father of her children.

I also think today of the many women I know who wish that they were mothers but for any of a variety of reasons are not. Mother's Day can be a difficult day for them. Being a mother is a blessing filled with many challenges. Motherhood is more important than ever as we see birthrates here in the U.S. and elsewhere declining. The Church and the world need more good, loving, faith-filled mothers. Please pray today for all mothers and for all who wish to be mothers.

As we think of our mothers and all mothers today, let's remember Mary, the Blessed Mother of Jesus and our

mother too. May is our month for remembering, honoring and celebrating her in a special way. We know that Jesus gave her to us as our mother by giving her to St. John, the Apostle, at the foot of the cross. We could never thank her sufficiently for all that she has done for us from the moment she accepted God's will at the Annunciation. She was faithful to God's will throughout her life.

Through all that Mary did in raising Jesus and caring for him, she made it possible for Jesus to embrace his world-changing ministry that would bring about our salvation. She continues her work as our mother, interceding for us and always trying to lead us closer to her son, Jesus. El Diario del Padre John

Mis hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

¡Feliz Día de la Madre a todas nuestras madres! Espero y rezo para que tengan un día maravilloso. Se merecen un gran día por haber dado a luz a sus hijos y por todo lo que han hecho para cuidarlos y criarlos, ayudándolos a llegar a ser todo aquello a lo que Dios los llama. Su vocación es hermosa y esencial. Espero que hoy sus hijos las colmen de amor y gratitud. Si hemos tenido la bendición de contar con una madre que nos ama, nunca podremos agradecerle lo suficiente su amor y todo lo que ha hecho por nosotros. Hoy es un día —más que ningún otro— para expresar nuestra gratitud. Si su madre vive y es una bendición para ustedes, díganle que la aman y agradézcanle todo lo que ha sido para ustedes y todo lo que ha hecho por ustedes. Si su madre ya ha fallecido, agradézcanle también a ella, pues seguramente ahora los escucha aún mejor. Recen por su paz y su gozo junto a Dios en el cielo.

Al reflexionar sobre el Día de la Madre, no puedo evitar pensar en las madres que conozco —tanto aquí como en otros lugares— que atraviesan dificultades por diversas razones: precisamente por el hecho de ser madres. Está la madre cuyo hijo padece una enfermedad crónica grave y se encuentra hospitalizado con frecuencia. Está la madre soltera que no recibe ningún apoyo del padre de su hijo y debe salir adelante por su cuenta. Está la madre que tiene un hijo en prisión y debe preocuparse no solo por él, sino también por el cuidado de sus nietos, dado que el progenitor de estos se encuentra encarcelado. Está la madre que ha tenido que enterrar a su hijo —ya fuera joven o adulto—; algo que, en el orden natural de las cosas, ninguna madre debería tener que hacer. Está la madre inmigrante que vive con el temor de que su familia sea separada debido a la deportación inesperada de su esposo o de ella misma hacia un lugar al que teme regresar, a causa de los peligros inherentes a la vida en su país de origen. Y está la madre a quien le resulta arduo atender las necesidades de sus hijos en un mundo que, en ocasiones, puede ser sumamente complejo y difícil. No resulta fácil para ninguna mujer ser madre, ni siquiera cuando cuenta con el apoyo de un buen esposo y padre de sus hijos.

Hoy también pienso en las muchas mujeres que conozco y que desearían ser madres, pero que, por diversas razones, no lo son. El Día de la Madre puede ser un día difícil para ellas. Ser madre es una bendición llena de muchos desafíos. La maternidad es más importante que nunca, pues vemos que las tasas de nacimientos —tanto aquí en los Estados Unidos como en otros lugares— están disminuyendo. La Iglesia y el mundo necesitan más madres buenas, amorosas y llenas de fe. Por favor, oren hoy por todas las madres y por todas aquellas que desean serlo.

Al pensar hoy en nuestras madres —y en todas las

madres—, recordemos a María, la Santísima Madre de Jesús y madre nuestra también. Mayo es nuestro mes para recordarla, honrarla y celebrarla de una manera especial. Sabemos que Jesús nos la entregó como madre nuestra al confiársela a San Juan Apóstol, al pie de la cruz. Jamás podríamos agradecerle lo suficiente por todo lo que ha hecho por nosotros, desde el momento en que aceptó la voluntad de Dios en la Anunciación. Ella fue fiel a la voluntad divina a lo largo de toda su vida. A través de todo lo que María hizo al criar a Jesús y cuidar de Él, hizo posible que Jesús abrazara su ministerio transformador del mundo, el cual traería consigo nuestra salvación. Ella continúa su labor como madre nuestra, intercediendo por nosotros y procurando siempre acercarnos más a su Hijo, Jesús. Demos gracias a María, a lo largo de este mes de mayo, por todo lo que ha hecho por nosotros. El Rosario es una manera maravillosa de meditar en los misterios que ella y Jesús vivieron. Protecting God's Children Training Information

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Please take a moment to read the following information regarding the Protecting God's Children Program for Adults that we use in our Quo Vadis Domine Family of Parishes in partnership with the Archdiocese of Detroit.

Protecting God's Children is a researched based program that was established in 1998 by VIRTUS to educate adults on how to become better protectors of children and vulnerable adults. Participants of this training will better their knowledge and become an integral part of the solution to prevent and respond to child sexual abuse.

This session is 3 hours long and is for adults only (ages 18 and up) and is required for all clergy, employees, lectors, eucharistic ministers, etc., and volunteers of the Archdiocese of Detroit's parishes, schools, and non-diocesan schools.

Our upcoming trainings will be taking place on:

- Wednesday, May 20 beginning at 9:30am (this session is open to parishioners of the QVD Family of Parishes)
- Saturday, May 30 beginning at 9:00am (this session is open to the general public)

You must register at www.virtusonline.org/

Trainings will be held in the St. Anne Room of the Holy Family Hall. We ask that you arrive before the start of the class as any late participants will not be admitted into the class and asked to join another session.

The materials in this training will include stories from survivors of child sexual abuse, as well as hearing from abusers. 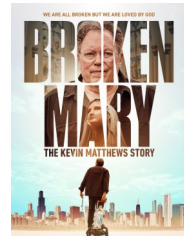

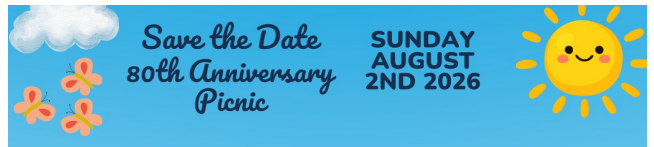

What is Arthritis?

Arthritis is a term used for conditions that cause joint pain, stiffness, swelling, and other joint symptoms. About one in five adults in the United States have been diagnosed with arthritis by a doctor.

Recognizing the different types of arthritis symptoms early can help in managing and treating the condition effectively. Here are some types of arthritis:

- Osteoarthritis (OA) is the most common type of arthritis. In joints with OA, the protective cartilage between bones starts to wear away. This allows the bones to rub together, which can cause pain and stiffness.
- Rheumatoid arthritis is an autoimmune inflammatory disease in which the body's immune system attacks its own joint tissue.
- Psoriatic arthritis is a form of arthritis that can affect the joints, skin, and nails.
- Infectious arthritis is caused by an infection in the joint from bacteria, viruses, or fungi.
- Reactive arthritis causes joint symptoms that are triggered by an infection in another part of the body.
- Gout is a painful type of inflammatory arthritis in which too much uric acid forms and then crystallizes and deposits in the joints.

What Causes Arthritis?

The main causes of arthritis depend based on which type, but generally include:

- Inflammation
- Joint damage
- Genetics
- Immune system dysfunction
- Infection caused by bacteria, viruses, or fungi
