Fr. John's Journal



My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Happy Pentecost Sunday! Thanks be to God for the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples on Pentecost Sunday, fifty days after Jesus' resurrection from the dead.

Thanks be to God for this magnificent beginning of the Church

as the coming of the Holy Spirit emboldened the disciples to go forth proclaiming Jesus and the Gospel with such great zeal. Thanks be to God for the continued movement and work of the Holy Spirit in the Church. The Holy Spirit has kept us going despite the odds, proclaiming Jesus and the Gospel, almost 2000 years later. Come Holy Spirit!

There are many Christians in other non-Catholic churches who tell Catholics that we need to be "baptized in the Holy Spirit." Sometimes Catholics don't know how to respond to these statements. We've all been baptized into the Most Holy Trinity with the words that we have from Jesus at the end of the Gospel of Matthew, "Baptize all nations (how?) in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit...." In the Sacrament of Baptism, we were baptized in the Holy Spirit. We've also received the fullness and the Gifts of the Holy Spirit in the Sacrament of Confirmation – wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and fear of the Lord. We don't need any other baptisms to receive the Holy Spirit. If anything, we need to discover the potential that the Gifts of the Holy Spirit hold for us. Maybe we should try calling on the Holy Spirit more to activate these gifts more fully in our lives? I pray to the Holy Spirit for wisdom frequently, for counsel regularly and fortitude occasionally. All of these gifts and the others gifts are already within us with so much potential for good.

Our celebration of Pentecost today brings to a close our Easter season. Next weekend will be the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity, and the following weekend will be the Feast of the Body and Blood of Jesus. Every Sunday when we gather for our celebration of the Mass - even outside of the Easter season - is a smaller celebration of the resurrection of Jesus, which happened on a Sunday. The Resurrection was the reason why early Christians embraced Sunday as their holy day rather than staying with the traditional Jewish Sabbath on Saturday. Jesus' resurrection is primary in our faith because this is the most powerful and decisive proof that Jesus is the Son of God as he said. This can and should be a source of great joy for us throughout the entire liturgical calendar.

What a blessing if we can keep that Easter joy alive in our hearts every day of our lives. What will you do to keep Easter joy going in your heart and life as we leave the Easter Season behind?

CSA – Catholic Services Appeal

The 2026 Catholic Services Appeal has begun. If you are registered in your parish, which we encourage you to be, you have probably received information in the mail regarding this year's campaign. The CSA has been for many years and continues to be a very important support to the mission of the Catholic Church here in the Archdiocese of Detroit. So many good, important ministries and programs in our archdiocese are dependent upon this appeal. Almost all of our parishes and all Catholics benefit directly or indirectly from this appeal, so our support of the CSA is very important once again this year.

It's a challenge in general for Catholics to think "beyond our parish" because our experience of the Church is often very local. An additional challenge that we face with this year's CSA is our archdiocesan restructuring process. I recognize that it's not an easy sell to promote the CSA in parishes like some of ours, which, potentially, may not be having Sunday Masses after July 1, 2027 when restructuring will begin to take effect. This would be very difficult for many of our parishioners, but we are all still Catholics, rooted in Jesus through the Eucharist. The mission of Jesus must continue here in our archdiocese. This requires CSA funding. We are offered the opportunity in this year's CSA to reflect upon Jesus' words, "For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be" (Matt. 6:21). Where is your heart? What is Jesus calling you to through this year's CSA?

I thank you in advance for your support of this year's CSA. The timetable for this campaign is shorter than it's been in the past since it only runs from now until the end of December. As usual, any funds that our parishes collect over our parish goals will return to our parishes. Contributions to the CSA are not subject to the normal AOD parish tax, so these contributions are actually more beneficial to our parishes than normal Sunday contributions.

I commend St. Alfred for the big push that the parish already made this past weekend toward reaching their goal. I'm not certain about the track records of our other three parishes, but sources have said that St. Alfred has surpassed its CSA goal by a wide margin the past fourteen years. Well done, St. Alfred!

El Diario del Padre John

Mis hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

¡Feliz Domingo de Pentecostés! Demos gracias a Dios por la venida del Espíritu Santo sobre los discípulos en el Domingo de Pentecostés, cincuenta días después de la resurrección de Jesús de entre los muertos. Demos gracias a Dios por este magnífico comienzo de la Iglesia, pues la venida del Espíritu Santo infundió valor a los discípulos para salir a proclamar a Jesús y el Evangelio con tan gran celo. Demos gracias a Dios por el continuo movimiento y la obra del Espíritu Santo en la Iglesia. El Espíritu Santo nos ha sostenido a pesar de las adversidades, permitiéndonos seguir proclamando a Jesús y el Evangelio casi 2000 años después. ¡Ven, Espíritu Santo!

Hay muchos cristianos en otras iglesias no católicas que dicen a los católicos que necesitamos ser “bautizados en el Espíritu Santo.” A veces, los católicos no saben cómo responder a estas afirmaciones. Todos hemos sido bautizados en la Santísima Trinidad con las palabras que recibimos de Jesús al final del Evangelio de Mateo: “Bauticen a todas las naciones (¿cómo?) en el nombre del Padre, y del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo...” En el Sacramento del Bautismo, fuimos bautizados en el Espíritu Santo. También hemos recibido la plenitud y los Dones del Espíritu Santo en el Sacramento de la Confirmación: sabiduría, entendimiento, consejo, fortaleza, ciencia, piedad y temor de Dios. No necesitamos ningún otro bautismo para recibir el Espíritu Santo. En todo caso, lo que necesitamos es descubrir el potencial que los Dones del Espíritu Santo encierran para nosotros. ¿Quizás deberíamos intentar invocar más al Espíritu Santo para activar estos dones más plenamente en nuestras vidas? Yo pido al Espíritu Santo sabiduría con frecuencia, consejo con regularidad y fortaleza ocasionalmente. Todos estos dones, así como los demás, ya se encuentran dentro de nosotros, con un inmenso potencial para el bien.

Nuestra celebración de Pentecostés de hoy pone fin a nuestro tiempo pascual. El próximo fin de semana celebraremos la Fiesta de la Santísima Trinidad, y el fin de semana siguiente, la Fiesta del Cuerpo y la Sangre de Jesús. Cada domingo en que nos reunimos para la celebración de la Misa —incluso fuera del tiempo pascual— constituye una celebración menor de la resurrección de Jesús, la cual tuvo lugar un domingo. La Resurrección fue la razón por la que los primeros cristianos adoptaron el domingo como su día sagrado, en lugar de mantener el tradicional Sábado judío. La resurrección de Jesús ocupa un lugar primordial en nuestra fe, pues constituye la prueba más poderosa y decisiva de que Jesús es el Hijo de Dios, tal como Él mismo afirmó. Esto puede y debe ser una fuente de gran alegría para nosotros a lo largo de todo el calendario litúrgico. ¡Qué bendición sería si lográramos mantener viva esa alegría pascual en nuestros corazones todos los días de nuestra vida! ¿Qué harás tú para mantener viva la alegría de la Pascua en tu corazón y en tu vida ahora que dejamos atrás el tiempo pascual?

CSA – Campaña de Servicios Católicos

Ha comenzado la Campaña de Servicios Católicos (CSA)

de 2026. Si usted está registrado en su parroquia —algo que le animamos a hacer—, es probable que haya recibido por correo información referente a la campaña de este año. La CSA ha constituido, durante muchos años y hasta el presente, un apoyo fundamental para la misión de la Iglesia Católica aquí en la Arquidiócesis de Detroit. Un gran número de ministerios y programas valiosos e importantes de nuestra arquidiócesis dependen de esta campaña. Casi todas nuestras parroquias, así como todos los católicos, se benefician directa o indirectamente de esta iniciativa; por ello, nuestro apoyo a la CSA resulta, una vez más, de suma importancia este año.

En general, constituye un desafío para los católicos pensar “más allá de nuestra parroquia,” ya que nuestra experiencia de la Iglesia suele ser muy local. Un desafío adicional que enfrentamos con la CSA de este año es nuestro proceso de reestructuración arquidiocesana. Reconozco que no resulta fácil promover la CSA en parroquias como algunas de las nuestras, las cuales, potencialmente, podrían dejar de celebrar las Misas dominicales después del 1 de julio de 2027, fecha en que la reestructuración comenzará a surtir efecto. Esto sería sumamente difícil para muchos de nuestros feligreses; sin embargo, todos seguimos siendo católicos, arraigados en Jesús a través de la Eucaristía. La misión de Jesús debe continuar aquí, en nuestra arquidiócesis. Para ello, se requiere la financiación de la CSA. La CSA de este año nos brinda la oportunidad de reflexionar sobre las palabras de Jesús: “Porque donde esté tu tesoro, allí estará también tu corazón” (Mt 6:21). ¿Dónde está tu corazón? ¿A qué te llama Jesús a través de la CSA de este año?

Les agradezco de antemano su apoyo a la CSA de este año. El plazo para esta campaña es más breve que en años anteriores, ya que se extiende únicamente desde ahora hasta finales de diciembre. Como es habitual, cualquier fondo que nuestras parroquias recauden por encima de sus metas parroquiales regresará a dichas parroquias. Las contribuciones a la CSA no están sujetas al impuesto parroquial ordinario de la AOD; por lo tanto, estas aportaciones resultan, de hecho, más beneficiosas para nuestras parroquias que las ofrendas dominicales habituales.

Felicito a San Alfredo por el gran impulso que la parroquia dio este pasado fin de semana para alcanzar su meta. No estoy seguro del historial de nuestras otras tres parroquias, pero algunas fuentes señalan que San Alfredo ha superado su objetivo de la CSA por un amplio margen durante los últimos catorce años. ¡Bien hecho, San Alfredo!

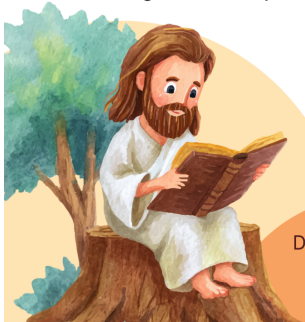

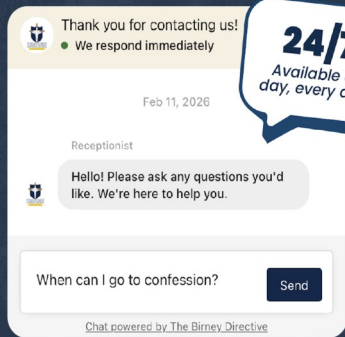

Some have asked if they can give a monetary donation to help offset some of the costs of our festival, and the answer is absolutely!

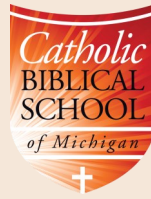

Pentecost is the time to be grateful for the beginnings of the Catholic Church and the roots of all Christians.

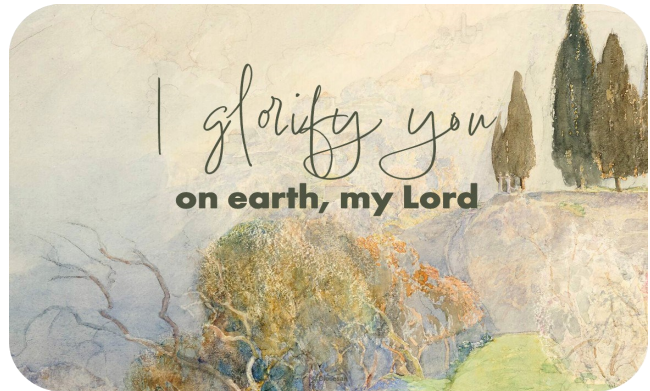

Health Ministry

Prostate Cancer is the most frequently diagnosed cancer in men. More than 218,000 men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer this year alone, and more than 27,000 will die.

"Prostate cancer and problems urinating caused by benign prostatic enlargement affect the vast majority of men as they age," said Dr. Christopher Saigal, an assistant professor of urology and a researcher at UCLA's Jonsson Cancer Center. "It makes sense to do what you can to avoid a foreseeable problem with your health"

- Maintain a healthy weight and exercise regularly.
- Eat five or more servings of fruits and vegetables every day. Tomatoes, watermelons, pink grapefruits, guava and papaya contain lycopene, a powerful antioxidant, and have been touted as prostate healthy. Cruciferous vegetables such as broccoli, cauliflower, cabbage, Brussels sprouts, bok choy and kale also are good choices.
- Limit your intake of red meat, especially high-fat or processed meats, and limit your intake of high-fat dairy products.
- Tell your doctor if you have a family history of prostate cancer. Having a father or brother with prostate cancer more than doubles a man's risk of developing this disease.
- Include more soy in your diet from sources such as tofu, soy nuts or soy flour or powders.
- Avoid tobacco and alcohol.
- Include in your diet selenium-rich foods such as wheat germ, tuna, herring and other seafood and shellfish, beef liver, kidney, eggs, sunflower and sesame seeds, cashews, mushrooms, garlic and onions. Selenium reduces risk of prostate cancer.
- Get screened. PSA blood test and digital rectal exams are recommended annually, beginning at age 50. Men at high risk, such as African American men or men with a Services.
