# Fr. John's Journal



My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This past weekend, we had our annual St. Frances Cabrini Festival. It was a great success. The weather was mostly great thanks to the prayers of the daily Mass folks that undoubtedly changed the weather on Saturday from a forecast of

thunderstorms and an 80 percent chance of rain to a beautiful day. Many people came to the festival and had a great time and helped the parish raise needed funds. I really appreciated that I saw parishioners from St. Alfred, St. Constance, St. Mary Magdalen, Our Lady of the Angels and St. André Bessette supporting the festival.

The parish received good attention from *Detroit Catholic* with a story and a lot of pictures of Archbishop Weisenburger's visit to the festival along with former associate pastor of Cabrini, Fr. Adam Nowak.

Many people asked me throughout the festival weekend what I thought of the festival. I told them all that I was impressed by everything about the festival, especially the number of people who came to the festival. Upon further reflection, the thing that impressed me the most was the dedication, commitment and generosity of the parishioners who volunteered to help in so many different ways to help make the festival happen. Parishioners who helped with the set-up and the take down and storage of everything for the festival; who cleaned up and hauled trash throughout the festival; who came early in the morning to clean the parish grounds and the surrounding neighborhoods; who cooked and served in the food booths; who served beverages; who ran the kids games, bingo, games of chance, the raffles, etc.

There was a tremendous amount of effort invested in putting on this festival by a dedicated army of volunteers. There's no way that a festival like this could happen without the work of many, many people, some of whom have been volunteering at the Cabrini festival for years if not decades. Who are these parishioners who volunteer so much here and parishioners who do the same in the other parishes of our family of parishes as well? What motivates parishioners to give so much of their time and energy to this parish when it would be so easy for them not to get involved?

As I ponder those questions, I think of my parents who were very involved at St. Joseph Parish in Trenton. When they registered in the parish, the pastor asked them how they were going to be involved in the parish. My dad began ushering right away and did so until the day that he died 40 years later. He was a dad's club member, a collection counter, a building committee member and a church cleaner with my mom after he

retired. My mom is still a longtime member of the women's guild, served as a lector, Eucharistic minister, catechist, parish council member and president, parish representative to the vicariate and a parish office volunteer. My parents were super parishioners like many of the parishioners in our family of parishes. They gave a powerful example to me of what it meant to give generously of their time, energy and talents to our home parish. The thing that I could see in them was that their involvement was not a burden to them. They felt this was what God was calling them to do. They were grateful to be able to serve and contribute to the life of their parish, and they enjoyed what they were doing.

Getting involved and serving in any way in our parishes is a blessing. Just ask the people who are involved in the various ministries, groups and events in our parishes. I am confident that they would be very articulate about the meaning that their ministries and service have for them. There are often sacrifices that parishioners make to serve as they do, but those sacrifices are outnumbered by the many blessings of serving God and our neighbor. One of the greatest blessings in getting more involved and serving in any way in our parishes is getting to know fellow parishioners and having a deeper sense of belonging to the parish. Coming to Mass on Sunday and participating in the Eucharist is a great blessing for us for the encounter that we have with Jesus in the Mass. The relationships and even friendships that develop from being more involved are an added bonus...icing on the cake."

We have an amazing bulletin for our family of parishes thanks to our family's communications director, Jennifer Schuman. I encourage you to look at the opportunities for service and greater involvement in our parishes that can be found in our Sunday bulletin and prayerfully discern how God might be calling you to a greater level of involvement in our parishes. I assure you that you won't regret it!

One last note about the Cabrini festival...I want to offer a big thank you to Tiffany & Rory Cogswell for working tirelessly for the past eight years as our festival chairs. We wouldn't have the incredible festival that we have at Cabrini without them and their tremendous dedication. Thank you, Tiffany & Rory! Thank you as well to Tim & Amy O'Connor who will be our new festival chairs moving forward.

# El Diario del Padre John

Mis hermanos y hermanas en Cristo:

El fin de semana pasado celebramos nuestro festival anual de Santa Francisca Cabrini. Fue un gran éxito. El tiempo fue magnífico en su mayor parte, gracias a las oraciones de los fieles que asisten a misa a diario; sin duda, sus oraciones lograron cambiar el pronóstico del sábado que anunciaba tormentas y un 80% de probabilidad de lluvia por un día hermoso. Muchas personas asistieron al festival y se la pasaron muy bien y ayudaron a la parroquia a recaudar los fondos necesarios. Me alegró mucho ver a feligreses de las parroquias de San Alfredo, Santa Constanza, Santa María Magdalena, Nuestra Señora de los Ángeles y San Andrés Bessette apoyando el evento. La parroquia recibió una atención positiva por parte de Detroit Catholic, que publicó un artículo y numerosas fotografías de la visita del arzobispo Weisenburger al festival, acompañado por el padre Adam Nowak, antiguo vicario parroquial de Cabrini.

Durante el fin de semana del festival, muchas personas me preguntaron qué opinaba del evento. A todos les dije que estaba impresionado por todo lo relacionado con el festival, especialmente por la gran cantidad de asistentes. Reflexionando más a fondo, lo que más me impresionó fue la dedicación, el compromiso y la generosidad de los feligreses que se ofrecieron como voluntarios para ayudar de tantas maneras diferentes a hacer posible el festival. Feligreses que ayudaron a montar, desmontar y guardar todo lo necesario para el evento; que limpiaron y retiraron la basura durante el mismo; que llegaron temprano por la mañana para limpiar los terrenos de la parroquia y los vecindarios circundantes; que cocinaron y atendieron los puestos de comida y bebidas; que organizaron los juegos infantiles, el bingo, los juegos de azar, las rifas, etcétera. Se invirtió un esfuerzo enorme en la organización de este festival gracias a un ejército dedicado de voluntarios. Sería imposible realizar un festival así sin el trabajo de muchísimas personas, algunas de las cuales llevan años, o incluso décadas, colaborando como voluntarias en el festival de Cabrini. ¿Quiénes son estos feligreses que ofrecen tanto de sí mismos aquí, y aquellos que hacen lo mismo en las otras parroquias de nuestra familia de parroquias? ¿Qué motiva a los feligreses a dedicar tanto tiempo y energía a esta parroquia, cuando sería tan fácil para ellos no involucrarse?

Al reflexionar sobre esas preguntas, pienso en mis padres, quienes participaban activamente en la parroquia de San José en Trenton. Cuando se inscribieron en la parroquia, el párroco les preguntó de qué manera iban a colaborar. Mi padre comenzó a servir como ujier de inmediato y continuó haciéndolo hasta el día de su muerte, cuarenta años después. Fue miembro del club de padres, contador de las colectas, integrante del comité de construcción y, tras jubilarse, ayudaba a mi madre a limpiar la iglesia. Mi madre sigue siendo miembro veterano de la asociación de mujeres y ha servido como lectora, ministra de la Eucaristía,

catequista, miembro y presidenta del consejo parroquial, representante de la parroquia ante el vicariato y voluntaria en la oficina parroquial. Mis padres fueron feligreses ejemplares, al igual que muchos de los miembros de nuestra familia de parroquias. Me dieron un ejemplo poderoso de lo que significaba dedicar generosamente su tiempo, energía y talentos a nuestra parroquia. Lo que yo percibía en ellos era que su participación no les suponía una carga; sentían que eso era lo que Dios les llamaba a hacer. Estaban agradecidos de poder servir y contribuir a la vida de su parroquia, y disfrutaban de lo que hacían.

Involucrarse y servir de cualquier manera en nuestras parroquias es una bendición. Basta con preguntar a las personas que participan en los diversos ministerios, grupos y eventos de nuestras parroquias. Estoy seguro de que sabrían expresar muy bien el significado que tienen para ellos sus ministerios y su servicio. A menudo, los feligreses hacen sacrificios para servir de esa manera, pero dichos sacrificios se ven superados con creces por las numerosas bendiciones que conlleva servir a Dios y al prójimo. Una de las mayores bendiciones de involucrarse más y servir en nuestras parroquias es llegar a conocer a otros feligreses y sentir un mayor sentido de pertenencia a la comunidad. Asistir a Misa los domingos y participar en la Eucaristía es una gran bendición para nosotros, gracias al encuentro que tenemos con Jesús en la celebración. Las relaciones e incluso las amistades que surgen al participar más activamente son un valor añadido... la cereza del pastel.

Contamos con un boletín extraordinario para nuestra familia de parroquias, gracias a la directora de comunicaciones de nuestra familia, Jennifer Schuman. Les animo a consultar las oportunidades de servicio y de mayor participación en nuestras parroquias que encontrarán en el boletín dominical, y a discernir en oración cómo Dios podría estar llamándoles a involucrarse más en ellas. ¡Les aseguro que no se arrepentirán!

Quiero expresar mi profundo agradecimiento a Tiffany y Rory Cogswell por haber trabajado incansablemente durante los últimos ocho años como coordinadores del festival. 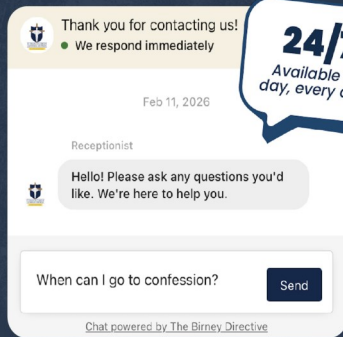

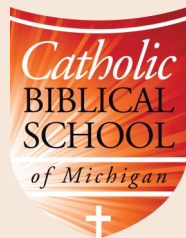

# Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

## Free of Charge

Knowing that God keeps his promises is part of being a believer. And how do we know that? Because we see how he has kept them throughout history. If we lose hope or begin to doubt that he will help us, it's useful to remember what he has already done.

Saint Paul talks about this in the second reading. Christ died for us while we were sinners, and so Saint Paul concludes that, having been saved from sin, we will also be saved from death. We are free from sin and death. And isn't that enough?

Jesus shows us that God can do even more. When he saw the crowds in today's Gospel, he felt compassion for them because they were "like sheep without a shepherd." They seemed to need leaders, someone who could show them the way to God. So Jesus responds in two ways.

First, he teaches his disciples to pray for more leaders. What he means is that if people are going to lead the Church, they must be sent by God. They are not elected by popular vote. They are "chosen" or called by God to serve.

Jesus is teaching us to pray for the leaders of the Church today. We can pray for all those in a leadership role, that they may be filled with wisdom and strength. Jesus also teaches us to pray for vocations to religious life.

The second thing Jesus does is send the twelve apostles to proclaim the Kingdom and heal illnesses. He teaches us that action must go hand in hand with prayer. This may mean offering our help to parish leaders, serving a term on the parish council, or encouraging our children to consider a religious vocation.

Why should we do these things? Remember what Paul said, that God saves us from sin and death. God gives us these gifts at no cost. He simply asks us to spread the good news of salvation.

That's what leadership within the Church is all about.

## Did You Know?

**The new Order of the Mass was introduced to the parish in 1970 through bulletin articles and monthly booklets entitled 'Celebrate.' The new Rite of Baptism was also introduced. Our Sunday Mass schedule changed to Saturday at 5:00pm and Sunday at 6:15am, 8:00am, 10:00am, 12:00pm and 6:30pm.**

The Teen Club started serving Coffee & Donuts in the parish hall every Sunday following the morning Masses. A used car was purchased for the sisters. This was made possible by the Ushers monthly 50/50 raffle.

A large campaign against "Proposal C" was initiated in the archdiocese and in our parish. This was a proposal against public aid for parochial schools. Parishioners worked tirelessly to save Catholic school.

Fr. Michael Houle, an assistant at SMM for six years was transferred. Fr. Buhl, pastor of St. Mary Magdalen Parish for 26 years, submitted his resignation to officially begin his retirement on June 30, 1971. Fr. Edward Mitchell was appointed assistant with the right of succeeding Fr. Buhl as pastor.

Fr. Mitchell was installed as pastor on July 2, 1971, and Fr. Buhl, who remained living at the Rectory, became Pastor Emeritus. Fr. Norbert Kendzierski was assigned as our new assistant priest.

After several years without a festival, one was planned for the last weekend of September 1972. It was a huge success and festivals became part of our lives again. A Vegas Night was a joint effort of the Dads Club and Christian Mothers. They raised enough money to install carpeting in the Sanctuary.

The Dads Club began monthly Pancake Breakfasts in the parish hall in 1972. The proceeds were used to repair and refinish the gym floor. They were able to work on the floor over the school's Christmas break in 1973 and saved the parish thousands of dollars by doing the work themselves.

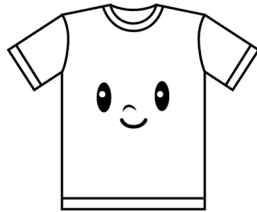

# Lift Up Your Hearts

Pope Francis has said for us to be sheep as well as shepherds.

“His heart was moved with pity for them... when Jesus saw the crowds.” (Mt. 9:36)

# Health Ministry



## 10 Warning Signs of Alzheimer's

1. Memory loss disrupting daily life, Forgetting recently learned information, repeating questions, relying on reminders. Typical aging: Occasionally forgetting names or appointments but remembering later.
2. Difficulty planning or solving problems, Trouble following a plan, working with numbers, or managing bills; tasks take longer. Typical aging: Occasional financial or household errors.
3. Trouble completing familiar tasks, Difficulty driving to known places, organizing tasks, or remembering game rules. Typical aging: Sometimes needing help with devices or settings.
4. Confusion about time or place, Losing track of dates, seasons, or how they arrived somewhere. Typical aging: Brief confusion about the day that resolves.
5. Vision or spatial problems, Difficulty judging distance, reading, or maintaining balance; driving issues. Typical aging: Vision changes from cataracts.
6. New problems with words, Trouble following conversations, repeating themselves, or misnaming objects. Typical aging: Occasional word-finding difficulty.
7. Misplacing items and inability to retrace steps, Putting things in unusual places and suspecting others of taking them. Typical aging: Misplacing items but finding them after retracing steps.
8. Poor judgment Money mistakes, reduced attention to grooming or hygiene. Typical aging: Infrequent poor decisions.
9. Withdrawal from work or social activities, Trouble following conversations may lead to reduced engagement. Typical aging: Sometimes feeling uninterested in social obligations.
10. Mood or personality changes Increased confusion, suspicion, fear, anxiety, or irritability. Typical aging: Preferring routines and becoming irritated when disrupted.

### When to Seek Medical Advice:

If you notice one or more of these signs in yourself or someone else, it's important to speak with a healthcare professional.

Early evaluation helps determine what's causing the changes and what support may be needed.
