My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Happy Father's Day to all of our fathers! I hope and pray that you have a great day and that you feel a lot of love and appreciation from your children today. You deserve a great day for what you've done to help care for and raise your children

to be all that God is calling them to be. Your vocation is beautiful and essential. If we have been blessed to have or had a father who loves us, we could never thank our fathers sufficiently for their love and for all that they have done for us. Today is a day, more than any other day, to express our gratitude. If your father is living and is a blessing to you, tell him that you love him and thank him for everything he has been for you and for all that he has done for you. If your father is deceased, thank him too. Let us pray for our fathers, living or deceased. May St. Joseph, patron saint of fathers, be an inspiration to our fathers and pray for them.

The role of fathers is so important in our world today. Although children may have a good mother, it is best if they have a good, loving, supportive father as well who is very present to his family. We can see this in the fathers who are not there for them or don't care for them in one way or another. Sadly, about one in four children in the U.S. do not have a father at home with them. Our society is suffering because there are too many self-centered, irresponsible and apathetic fathers these days. The negative impact of poor fathers is not surprising. Statistics show that youth with absent or abusive fathers are far more likely to drop out of school, use illegal drugs, run away from home, end up in prison or take their own lives. This is very sobering. As we know, many mothers are heroic in the way that they play the roles of both mother and father for their children. Many heroic fathers play both roles as well. Our children need fathers who, with their wives, will provide for their children, not just materially but also spiritually and emotionally and will be there for them, especially in those critical moments of life.

In the Sacrament of Baptism, parents and godparents promise to train their children in the practice of our Catholic faith and to teach them to follow God's commandments as Jesus taught us, by loving God and neighbor. Mothers have a unique role to play in following through on this promise. Fathers have a critical role to play in this as well. If a father has little interest in coming to Mass on Sunday or in praying at home as a family, it makes it much more difficult for the mother to help her children see the importance of practicing, expressing and living our faith. We need strong spiritual leadership from our fathers.

Saint Joseph played the role of protector as the stepfather of Jesus. Fathers now are called to protect

their children as well from the many dangers in our world, especially the spiritual dangers of losing faith and choosing serious sin. I encourage all fathers to take very seriously their important role in the faith formation of their children.

Pope Leo's Encyclical

For the past few years, there has been a lot of conversation in our world about artificial intelligence and the possible benefits and risks of this for our world. Some people have wholeheartedly embraced AI as it has advanced very quickly and think it's wonderful. Many others are quite anxious about problems that might come from AI and about where AI might lead us. Since AI has emerged, there has not been a voice of reason and moral authority regarding AI that people have desired. Then Pope Leo published his recent encyclical, "Magnifica Humanitas." His encyclical has received a lot of positive press, probably because of all of the concerns that people have about AI.

The title of his encyclical, "Magnificent Humanity" is significant. AI may be amazing in many ways, but it is nothing compared with our being made in the image and likeness of God. The first sentence of his encyclical is very powerful: "Humanity, created by God in all its grandeur, is today facing a pivotal choice: either to construct a new Tower of Babel or to build the city in which God and humanity dwell together." I recommend reading Pope Leo's encyclical. It's a very important document for our time. I have gotten a copy of this encyclical. I won't be reading an AI generated summary!

Homework Assignment

Two Sundays ago, I gave people at Mass a homework assignment. I asked them to read and prayerfully reflect upon the sixth chapter of the Gospel of John to help them come, perhaps, to an even deeper appreciation of the importance and the blessing of the Eucharist in our lives. I recommend doing this homework! Extra credit: bring someone with you to Mass who does not come or has fallen away from coming to Mass.

El Diario del Padre John

Mis hermanos y hermanas en Cristo:

¡Feliz Día del Padre a todos nuestros padres! Espero y rezo para que tengan un día maravilloso y que hoy sientan mucho amor y aprecio por parte de sus hijos. Se merecen un gran día por todo lo que han hecho para cuidar y criar a sus hijos, ayudándoles a llegar a ser todo aquello a lo que Dios los llama. Su vocación es hermosa y esencial. Si hemos tenido la bendición de contar con un padre que nos ama o lo tuvimos en el pasado, nunca podremos agradecerles lo suficiente por su amor y por todo lo que han hecho por nosotros. Hoy es el día, más que ningún otro, para expresar nuestra gratitud. Si su padre vive y es una bendición para ustedes, díganle que lo aman y agradézcanle todo lo que ha sido y ha hecho por ustedes. Si su padre ha fallecido, agradézcanle también. Oremos por nuestros padres, ya sean vivos o difuntos. Que San José, patrono de los padres, sea una inspiración para ellos e interceda por ellos.

El papel de los padres es sumamente importante en el mundo actual. Aunque los hijos tengan una buena madre, lo ideal es que también cuenten con un padre bueno, cariñoso y comprensivo, que esté muy presente en la vida de su familia. Esto se hace evidente cuando observamos a aquellos padres que no están presentes o que, de una forma u otra, no cuidan de sus hijos. Lamentablemente, cerca de uno de cada cuatro niños en los Estados Unidos no tiene a su padre en casa. Nuestra sociedad sufre porque hoy en día hay demasiados padres egoístas, irresponsables y apáticos. No sorprende el impacto negativo que tienen los padres que no cumplen adecuadamente su función. Las estadísticas demuestran que los jóvenes con padres ausentes o abusivos tienen muchas más probabilidades de abandonar los estudios, consumir drogas ilegales, huir de casa, terminar en prisión o quitarse la vida. Es una realidad que invita a una seria reflexión. Como bien sabemos, muchas madres realizan una labor heroica al desempeñar tanto el papel de madre como el de padre para sus hijos. Asimismo, muchos padres heroicos asumen ambos roles. Nuestros hijos necesitan padres que, junto con sus esposas, provean para ellos no solo en lo material, sino también en lo espiritual y emocional y que estén presentes, especialmente en los momentos críticos de la vida.

En el sacramento del Bautismo, los padres y padrinos prometen formar a sus hijos en la práctica de nuestra fe católica y enseñarles a seguir los mandamientos de Dios tal como Jesús nos enseñó: amando a Dios y al prójimo. Las madres desempeñan un papel único a la hora de cumplir esta promesa, pero los padres también tienen un papel fundamental en ello. Si un padre muestra poco interés en asistir a Misa los domingos o en rezar en casa en familia, a la madre le resulta mucho más difícil ayudar a sus hijos a comprender la importancia de practicar, expresar y vivir nuestra fe. Necesitamos un

liderazgo espiritual sólido por parte de los padres. San José desempeñó el papel de protector como padre adoptivo de Jesús. Hoy en día, los padres también están llamados a proteger a sus hijos de los numerosos peligros de nuestro mundo, especialmente de los peligros espirituales de perder la fe y caer en pecado grave. Animo a todos los padres a tomarse muy en serio su importante papel en la formación en la fe de sus hijos.

La encíclica del Papa León

En los últimos años, se ha hablado mucho en todo el mundo sobre la inteligencia artificial y sus posibles beneficios y riesgos. Algunas personas han acogido con entusiasmo la IA, dado su rápido avance, y la consideran algo maravilloso. Otras muchas sienten gran inquietud ante los problemas que podría acarrear y hacia dónde podría llevarnos. Desde la aparición de la IA, se echaba en falta una voz de razón y autoridad moral al respecto. Entonces, el Papa León publicó su reciente encíclica, “Magnífica Humanitas”. El documento ha tenido una acogida muy positiva en los medios, probablemente debido a las preocupaciones que la gente alberga sobre la IA. El título de la encíclica, “Magnífica Humanidad”, es significativo. La IA puede resultar asombrosa en muchos aspectos, pero no es nada comparada con el hecho de haber sido creados a imagen y semejanza de Dios. La primera frase de la encíclica es muy poderosa: “La humanidad, creada por Dios en toda su grandeza, se enfrenta hoy a una elección decisiva: construir una nueva Torre de Babel o edificar la ciudad donde Dios y la humanidad habiten juntos”. Recomiendo leer la encíclica del Papa León; es un documento de gran importancia para nuestros tiempos. Ya he conseguido un ejemplar. ¡Y no pienso leer un resumen generado por inteligencia artificial!

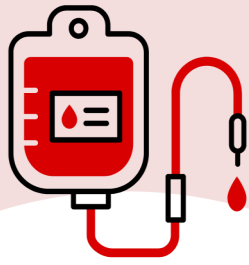

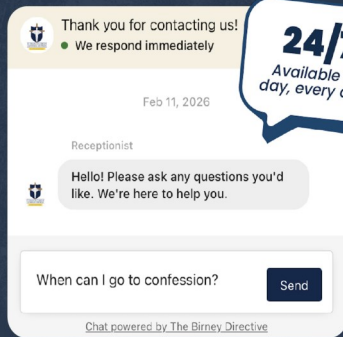

Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Paradox of Faith

"Do not fear men," Jesus says. He is talking about fearing those who persecute you for your faith. In the verses preceding this Gospel passage, he tries to prepare us for persecution and says that just as people did to him (Jesus), they would do to his followers.

But what happened to Jesus? He was crucified, but he rose from the dead. He triumphed over his persecutors. They couldn't stop him. And that's what he promises us too. We may suffer any persecution, ridicule, or discrimination for our faith, but we cannot be destroyed as long as we hold to that faith.

The best way to keep the faith alive is to give it to others. It sounds like a contradiction, but it means that when we spread the faith, our faith grows too. Sure, it takes courage to tell someone else about our faith, but when we share our stories about what God means to us, we relive those experiences and remember what God has done for us.

And when we allow others to share their faith with us, we feel encouraged and supported. That's why Jesus says there is nothing hidden that will not be revealed: True faith is never hidden; it must be shared.

Sometimes we may hesitate when speaking about faith. If we are tempted to remain silent, we are allowing the devil to have his way. The only thing we should fear is our weakness, not Satan's power.

That's why Jesus said that whoever denies him before men, he will also deny him. However, Jesus died for our sins, so not even they can destroy us if we turn to the Lord. Just as God knows every sparrow that falls, He also knows us when we fall, and He values us far more than sparrows.

So thank Him for His forgiveness, but don't forget to spread the word that you've been forgiven. You might encourage someone else to have the courage to return to the Lord, and thus achieve another victory of faith that overcomes fear.

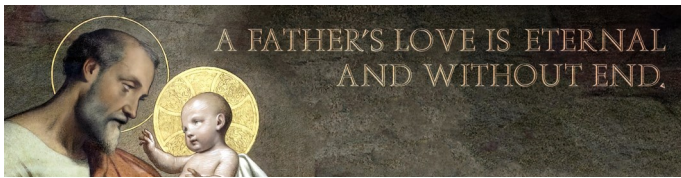

Did You Know?

The new Order of the Mass was introduced to the parish in 1970 through bulletin articles and monthly booklets entitled 'Celebrate.' The new Rite of Baptism was also introduced. Our Sunday Mass schedule changed to Saturday at 5:00pm and Sunday at 6:15am, 8:00am, 10:00am, 12:00pm and 6:30pm.

The Teen Club started serving Coffee & Donuts in the parish hall every Sunday following the morning Masses. A used car was purchased for the sisters. This was made possible by the Ushers monthly 50/50 raffle.

A large campaign against "Proposal C" was initiated in the archdiocese and in our parish. This was a proposal against public aid for parochial schools. Parishioners worked tirelessly to save Catholic school.

Fr. Michael Houle, an assistant at SMM for six years was transferred. Fr. Buhl, pastor of St. Mary Magdalen Parish for 26 years, submitted his resignation to officially begin his retirement on June 30, 1971. Fr. Edward Mitchell was appointed assistant with the right of succeeding Fr. Buhl as pastor.

Fr. Mitchell was installed as pastor on July 2, 1971, and Fr. Buhl, who remained living at the Rectory, became Pastor Emeritus. Fr. Norbert Kendzierski was assigned as our new assistant priest.

After several years without a festival, one was planned for the last weekend of September 1972. It was a huge success and festivals became part of our lives again. A Vegas Night was a joint effort of the Dads Club and Christian Mothers. They raised enough money to install carpeting in the Sanctuary.

The Dads Club began monthly Pancake Breakfasts in the parish hall in 1972. The proceeds were used to repair and refinish the gym floor. They were able to work on the floor over the school's Christmas break in 1973 and saved the parish thousands of dollars by doing the work themselves.

10 Warning Signs of Alzheimer's

1. Memory loss disrupting daily life, Forgetting recently learned information, repeating questions, relying on reminders. Typical aging: Occasionally forgetting names or appointments but remembering later.
2. Difficulty planning or solving problems, Trouble following a plan, working with numbers, or managing bills; tasks take longer. Typical aging: Occasional financial or household errors.
3. Trouble completing familiar tasks, Difficulty driving to known places, organizing tasks, or remembering game rules. Typical aging: Sometimes needing help with devices or settings.
4. Confusion about time or place, Losing track of dates, seasons, or how they arrived somewhere. Typical aging: Brief confusion about the day that resolves.
5. Vision or spatial problems, Difficulty judging distance, reading, or maintaining balance; driving issues. Typical aging: Vision changes from cataracts.
6. New problems with words, Trouble following conversations, repeating themselves, or misnaming objects. Typical aging: Occasional word-finding difficulty.
7. Misplacing items and inability to retrace steps, Putting things in unusual places and suspecting others of taking them. Typical aging: Misplacing items but finding them after retracing steps.
8. Poor judgment Money mistakes, reduced attention to grooming or hygiene. Typical aging: Infrequent poor decisions.
9. Withdrawal from work or social activities, Trouble following conversations may lead to reduced engagement. Typical aging: Sometimes feeling uninterested in social obligations.
10. Mood or personality changes Increased confusion, suspicion, fear, anxiety, or irritability. Typical aging: Preferring routines and becoming irritated when disrupted.

When to Seek Medical Advice:

If you notice one or more of these signs in yourself or someone else, it's important to speak with a healthcare professional.

Early evaluation helps determine what's causing the changes and what support may be needed.
